



II. PASTORAL LETTER - I

DECALOGUE AND PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH - II

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and the faithful,

The Kingdom Come!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come to fulfill them" (Mt 5:17).

In the year of Decalogue and the Precepts of the Church in our diocese it is worth reflecting over that gospel verse. Jesus gives us an insight into his ministry and the orientation of the Divine Word. Jesus asserts the supreme authority of God's law. Divine law is ultimate and unchangeable. "Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven" (Mt. 5:19). The five possible implications of this statement of Jesus are:

- (i) The Divine Word/Law is everlasting; it will sustain the mortal world.
- (ii) The Divine Word/Law was written with intent; it was meant to be fulfilled.
- (iii) The Divine Word/Law possessed plenary authority, even the smallest letter of it is established.
- (iv) The Divine Word/Law is faithful and trustworthy; 'everything' always will be accomplished.

Jesus says that he did not come to abolish the law and the prophets. In other words, his purpose was not to change the Word, dismantle it or render it invalid. The prophecies will be fulfilled, the law will continue to accomplish the purpose for which it was given (Is. 39:10-11). Jesus came to establish the new law.

Christ is the culmination of the law (Gal. 10:6). Jesus Christ fulfilled the law as a teacher and a note. He taught people to obey the law (Mt. 27, 35-49, Mk. 1:46) and he did obey the laws with humility (Jn. 8:46, 1 Pt. 2:23). He came to complete the six commandments and established the new (2 Thes. 8:8-9, 13, 12:24). The Law of Moses of the Old Testament is renamed under the law of Christ (For. 31: 31, 33).

As we have dedicated 2024 as the year of the Doctrines and the Precepts of the Church, we shall examine our allegiance to the truth of the law in our life. The Ten Commandments set human life on right track. Our rapport with God and that among ourselves is a yardstick for every Christian to know one's own discipleship and live it freely (Jn. 12:35). The first three commandments are about our relationship with God and the rest seven serves for the smooth relationship among ourselves. Ultimately these commandments are meant for every human person to be morally upright and good. The Ten Commandments summarized into two love God and love neighbour (Mt. 22:37-40). That should be ultimately the spirituality of any religion. The core of Christ's teaching is the same: "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second is this, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these (Mk 12:30-31).

The Precepts of the Church are meant to train us to be devout Christians-Catholics. For a disciplined Catholic the Precepts are helpful and useful. The observance of the Precepts shows one's allegiance to the Church. For an organized community like Catholics, such laws are good for social harmony and spiritual health.

So, dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and my dear people, we shall observe all hours - civil and ecclesiastical - with humility and pilgrimage to respective shrines for the soul's own welfare and that

of the community, the Church and the society as a whole. May the celebration of the year of the Decalogue and the Precepts of the Church, be an occasion to reiterate our commitment to all the laws in general, and those connected to each one of us in particular, both civil and ecclesiastical. God bless everyone.

PASTORAL LETTER-II

Priests: Disciples and Discipleship

Deodes Fokan,

Thy Kingdom Come!

Congregate in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

"The depth of a priest's conversion is the measure of his apostolic vocation". (Vatican II)

Priesthood is an inimitable gift and a remarkable experience. It is not only participation in the eternal priesthood of Christ but also sharing with him to serve the humanity in humility. "Come not to be served but to serve and to become a servant for many" (Mt 20:26). He goes on the beautiful example of serving others to the extent of washing the feet of his disciples. "So, if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. ... For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." (Jn. 13:14-15). Thus, he communicated to us that authority is for service. His example went to the extent of laying down his life for others; "He who has greatest love for him, to let down one's life for each friend" (Jn. 15:13). He teaches us this great example not only by words but also by showing it to us by his own example.

From Christ, the eternal point, we learn that, to be a priest means to be a servant of others. We are out of our creaturely and completely we are at the service of others. Humility is the basic fabric of priesthood. No one eats its own fruits and no river runs to ocean water that flows in it. Moses shown as great example of a human. God required such meekness as witness before to Jesus and to presence in life. Saint John Maria Vianney once said, "The priest is not a person for himself; he does not give himself absolute power; he does not administer sacraments to himself. He is for you". He is always at service for others. An option and decision

priest as a priest and our apostolic works called as disciplined life and discipleship is our identity. They go hand in hand and mutually enhancing and uplifting.

As priests, we are leaders of the Christian community. A leader is called to be a disciplined person. Church discipline is needed for every person for each one of us. His integrity, his prayer life, his availability for others, his devotion to Jewish laws, and his commitment for learning and living examples of his disciplined life. We are called to lead a disciplined life. First and foremost one should be armed with "counsel" that will give us a stimulus to guide others. Schedule of discipline in spiritual life like daily meditation, celebration of Holy Quicena, spiritual reading, confession, monthly refection, priestly gatherings, annual retreat etc. are the means for the people to realize the integrity of life. A good deal of our discipline is also connected to the office of administration. Abiding by the canonical regulations and Episcopal Statutes greatly supports our discipline and integrity of discipline. Respect and adherence to code law is also making a great deal in this regard. Above all the position of the good command of love (Mt.22:37-39) that is our life will grow and better.

From the life and teachings of Jesus in the gospels, we learn that discipleship is a pre-requisite for discipleship. To be a disciple of Christ is a radical call. If you want to be my disciple, leave everything behind and follow me; "Whoever comes to me and does not leave father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple" (Lk.14:26). Christ's discipleship is greatly challenging and demanding. It is not easy to become a genuine disciple of Christ. The discipleship of Christ is for a certain. Mark 3: 14-15 announces the purpose of being a disciple of Christ. "And he appointed twelve, whom he also called apostles, to be with him, sent to be sent to him to proclaim the message, and to have authority

extending their influences. It will be implemented as we already know it biblical injunctions and theological implications.

Keeping rapport with everyone, respectful approach and maintaining healthy relation with all take poverty life and ministry effective. Pope is one of his addressed to priests educate "we need priests who are fully human, capable of healthy relationships, and capable in communicating the challenges of ministry, so that the proclamation of the gospel may reach the people through their humanity manifested by the same spirit of Jesus. Let us never forget the saving power of the gospel".

Thirdly Kolonika is the first trait of our discipline and discipleship. It invites us for mutual respect and service to one another. Secondly, it calls us to sacramental presence in our communities and in our apostolate. Thirdly, it demands genuine relationship and good will to oneself with our co-workers. Fourthly, it urges our availability to the people of God and others. We shall follow the principle, to serve ourselves to natural in our relation and ministry. It shall clarify our discipleship of Christ in poverty discipline. God bless everyone.

PASTORAL LETTER - III

GREEN DIOCESE

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and the faithful,

The Kingdom Cometh!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

"The LORD God made the earth and put the entire Garden of Eden in it and kept it" (Gen. 2:15).

The year 2011 we observed as our diocese as the Green Diocese Campaign with motto "Service Narasimha Friend". We could create some awareness among people about the importance and need to the preserve the ecosystem for a bright future of our generations ahead. At least few had developed this concept in life as a matter of concern that undergoes the environment which is our home of existence and inheritance. As it should not be a one man project and it has to be continued for a better condition of environment for us today and for our future generation. So, once again I wish to write this pastoral letter on environmental protection.

The slogan "Lead by Self" apprehension of environment by Pope Francis was a clarion call to inspect the earth and nature. He has been consistently calling the attention of the world leaders and everyone in the world to the fact that "everything is connected, and as a family of nature we must have a common concern, to see that the environment is cleaner, pure, and preserved well. A solution to climate change cannot protecting the planet and vulnerable people, and we exist here, both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor". His call goes on, "The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. See, water, soil, animals - everything is, as it were, a cry of God".

Key Pope Francis has come out with another Apostolic Exhortation "Fratelli Tutti" (Praised be God) promulgated on 4th October 2020. Pope's Exhortation is written at the same time sounding an alarm and a call for co-responsibility in the face of the climate emergency. We all experience it at different levels in different places and countries. He says that, it is one of the principal challenges facing the society and the global community and the effects of climate change are borne by most vulnerable people whether at home or around the world (LD #3). The world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing to the breaking point. It is可想而知 that the impact of climate change will increasingly prejudice the lives and families of many peoples.

The solutions are simple. We need to do is to reduce our consumption, recycle as much as possible, reuse all that we can and most importantly reduce and reject those things that cause damage to the environment. He already listed in the document a series of urge and purposes that need to urgent climate action as a follow up to Laudato Si' (Our Common Home) that was written eight years ago. We need to reflect the different ways we can contribute to the elaboration in order to protect our common home.

The fundamental duty of each citizen regarding environment is given in our Constitution under Article 31 A (i) & (ii). It states, "It shall be the duty of every citizen of India to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life and to have compassion for the living creature". Citizen involvement is crucial to the establishment and implementation of a fair and effective environmental protection regime in any country.

Some of the known ways to protect the environment are to reduce, reuse, recycle, conserve water, save electricity, phasing and create awareness among the people on environmental pollution, preserve and the plantation etc. Proper drainage

systems and waste treatment is a must before discharge waste is released to any water body such as rivers, sea or ocean. Solid waste of poor households such as vegetable peels, onion skin, waste paper etc. should be thrown in covered garbage bags. It is necessary to conserve our environment to maintain the ecological balance and sustainability of the ecosystem. Pope says that social effects of this climate crisis are already irreversible for atleast several hundred years and "the healing of the planet will not be finished in a handful of years" (LD # 13).

As we know that India's water crisis is a permanent problem. Although India has 16 percent of the world's population, the country possess only four percent of the world's total water resources. India is water-stressed due to changing weather patterns and repeated drought. Studies show that about 236 of the 700 districts in India have reported "critical" or "over-exploited" ground water level according to the recent Central Ground Water Board data (from 2017). There is an urgent need to educate and motivate future generations to practice frugal ecology that is to be aware that the earth has enough resources, required for the needs of all human beings. These resources, however must be shared and not to be misused for the few.

It is important to be mindful of how we treat the environment to keep everything in harmony. Recycling helps us save resources from nature and keep our planet healthier. Preserving healthy environment and biodiversity is crucial for our well-being, sustainable-energy, water, food, and a stable climate. We should also support policies and practices that limit climate change and promote sustainability in our daily lives, like using public transport, reducing waste, and supporting non-fossil-fuel products.

The Apostolic Exhortation Laudato Si' raises another troubling reflection for our 'sufficing planet'. Pope's exhortation has been full concern about the use of 'our home'. The responses to the

climate change have not been adequate in his evaluation; something more and much more has to be done. May I request everyone to take some practical steps to protect the environment. Deal with nature with delicacy development at the cost of danger to nature by all means must be avoided. Love nature and lead a life friendly. Please take seriously environmental issues and resolve to do the best, lest we endanger our 'Common Home' focus and for our future generations.

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and the Faithful,

Thy Kingdom Come!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

But you, Israel, my servant, Jacob, whom I have chosen, the offspring of Abraham, my friend, you whom I took from the ends of the earth, and called from its fullest corners, saying to you, "You are my servant, I have chosen you and not cast you off"; do not fear; for I am with you, do not be afraid; for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand (Is 41:8-10).

This is the assurance God has given us. Jesus repeatedly emphasised this in his teachings. "Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Lk 12:32, Rv 14:27, Lk 12:17 etc). The assurance of Jesus is very reassuring when he says: "When they bring you before the synagogues, the rulers, and the authorities, do not worry about how you are to defend yourselves or what you are to say; for the Holy Spirit will teach you at the very hour what you ought to say" (Lk 12:11-12). It is said that there are 365 times the word 'Now' or similar phrases in the Bible. It shows that practically each day of the year God is asking us to go ahead with courage and vigour!

I write this circular in the context of some news from different corners of our country which are not very welcoming and create a sense of fear and uncertainty in our nation ahead. We have no excuse but to continue our mission. These are some

governments by mass when election is round the corner. Anyhow (as far as our problems), but just challenges Jesus and the Disciples had and the Church has faced many challenges in the past. They are not new to the Church. Probability we are new to them as we personally confront them these days. It is an outcome of the three temptations (Mt 4:1-11 & Lk 4:1-11) by a challenging road and reliance in the providence of God, the Father (Cf. Lk 12:27-34). We shall give no other option but The son of Leon helps us to equip ourselves in face these challenges with a spiritual road and enthusiasm. We shall keep this as a special invitation for our Leon 2014.

As the nation is getting ready for general election I beseech everyone to vote and electoral function is a responsible way and guide our people accordingly, so that we may have a genuinely elected government which respects the constitutional rights of the people of the country. "We shall pray that there shall be fair election process and there shall be social and religious harmony, and welfare of every citizen is attended to. The developments in the recent past in some parts of our country are really shocking. The recently concluded NNCPV election, general body meeting of CBCI held at Bangalore (See 31 – Feb 07, 2013) had the following as the theme: "The Church's response to the current socio-political situation of the country and the benefits and challenges of artificial intelligence (AI)". The message of CBCI was: "As Christians our best weapon is PRAYER, for with God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26). The CBCI asks that each diocese observe Friday 22 March 2013 as a day of prayer and fasting for peace and harmony in our society. May I request everyone to remember it in our parishes and institutions and by the media. While using the modern technologies of social media and Artificial Intelligence, the CBCI reminds the pitfalls of AI and insist the possible dangers.

In this comment I wish to bring to your notice the following:

1. Study well with mass participation with regard to various incidents in our institutions. Avoid any chance of misconstrued or misinterpretations whatsoever. Additional care is required when we deal with students in the schools and Colleges in our formation houses particularly when they are minors. It is well that we obtain all necessary documents from our Diocesan, such as Adhar card (in age group), consent letter of parents and spouses, marriage certificate of the parents etc. Please do all what is needed and keep our part safe and secure.
2. May I request to be 'profound like prophets and ignorant like doves' (Mt 10:16-18) in our ministry of evangelization. It is our mission and we cannot allow it. The great command of Christ is: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt. 28: 19-20). We shall not seek comfort zones but we need to be comfortable in the word of the Lord. Mind you, these are not problems but only challenges. Jesus and the Disciples too had such challenges and they faced them with courage and reliance in the providence of God. We too shall follow the path.
3. D. It is important that we live witness of Christian values. Transparency in accounts, simplicity in life-style, modesty in conductions are are some ways of Christian witness. Keep update FCRA, 12A regulations, but we are accused of tax evasions. Many people observe it as a clear following of Christ and his tribute to our daily life. We shall continue to preach what we practice and practice what we preach.
4. In our diocese in some areas people are having 'such' due to some seismic influences and misinterpretations, and it is observed that we need to frequent our visit to villages, family

visit, Holy Quarantine prayer sessions in the villages, our availability to the people etc. to overcome such hurdles. We shall make great efforts to keep our fold together and take care of them in the best way possible in faith formation and meeting their greater needs such as service to the sick, facilities for further education, employment opportunities etc.

- On 18 December 2013 the Diocese of Puthia (DOP) promulgated a declaration with regard to the 'Blessing' of gay individuals. The discussion about this document in the social media and mass media is on the rise. The Church's stand about marriage is, that which is contracted between a man and a woman (DOP 1946, DOP 100-9 & CCEO 778). Church does not accept any other relationships as a valid. However Church is in their duty to everyone including gay individuals. Way to pray for them and 'Bless' individually so that they may live according to God's plan and observe the teachings of the Church. Please do not be misguided.
- As we are in the season of Lent we shall do the acts of penance such as fast, abstinence, etc. and do the devotional practices like Stations of the Cross, Lament Prayers, Adoration, Almsgiving etc. to make our Lent meaningful and fruitful. I wish everyone a fruitful Lent.
- We are in the year of Decalogue and the Precepts of the Church. Please follow the hourly schedule and other directions to make our people to make an effort to observe the laws of the country and of the Church faithfully and with alacrity (Cf. Chanda Samachar No. 182, Vol. XXII January-April 2013, pp.2-4 & 69-71).
- The diocese is planning a Walkathon on Evangelization for priests and religious (April 22-24), for Christians, Italy and roads (April 26-27) and for propagation and education

(April 26 to June 01). Bro. Thomas Paul will be a resource person. The details shall be finalized later (Cf. Chanda Samachar January-April 2014, p.7). Please mark the date.

My Kingdom Come!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

I wish to communicate to you the following as a piece of information and appreciation.

- 1) Encouraging retreat is running quite well. The Fathers and Sisters are co-operating with retreating masters, home visitors, counseling etc. Thank everyone for the same. The people's response is also very good. If you have suggestions to make, however, will better. Thanks to Fr. Ravi and team for the good work.
- 2) The different Jubilee house construction project was very successful. I sincerely thank everyone for co-operation and good will. We shall continue it in the same spirit and enthusiasm as the years ahead. May I bring back to your attention of all the diocese only nearby areas as beneficiaries on priority basis.
- 3) Village Quakmas and family units are doing rather well in the diocese. Wherever it is to be improved please do my suggestion. We shall not forget that they were the characteristic traits of our mission. We shall continue our Incusso-evangelization.
- 4) Running of hospitals, Boardings, formation houses, dispensaries need more care and concern as it has become

very vulnerable and delicate these days due to too many factors. We shall exercise these missions as they are the lifeline of our mission. The diocese shall be duty to support in any occasion of emergency. Please be patient enough to deal with child related difficulties in the schools and hospital boardings. By patting and loving behaviour we can win over many. If not we may have to face the consequence. I call everyone to cultivate a childlike-faith approach towards all.

- 5) Co-operation and sharing of resources among the institutions is to be done generously and consistently as far as possible. We are progressing step by step in this regard. Please, form a group to collect funds in each unit needs time and patience. As CNEWA subsidy to our boardings is issued after Covid-19 Pandemic, may I request every religious Congregation serving in the diocese to contribute generously to the Jubilee Fund as per the stipulation in the Specialized Statute.
- 6) Simplicity in life style is very important and it witnesses greatly Christian values and the spirit of Christ. So also is important simplicity in construction, renovations, needs of word etc. Hence, and shall fit the criterion in such manner. Avoid all posh structures, fountains etc. However the resources for public utility such as educational institutions, health care etc. need adequate space, convenience etc. for the service required.
- 7) The military subsidy for the sisters have an increase of Rs. 500/- (Five hundred rupees) per month from April 2021.
- 8) Once again I remind you the "2nd Captain" I proposed in the Diamond Jubilee year for our mission should Evangelism, Improvement and Ecology. Kindly do whatever is feasible to advance ahead in our mission more effectively.


- 9) In the diocese we are following the liturgical discipline rather until Ajyoti starts anywhere, kindly do take necessary measures to control it and join in the celebration of the Church.
- 10) Take necessary measures to keep our fold together. Kindly do not allow the outside forces to create disintegration among our people. Please keep a watch over it.

HOLY CHRISM MASS HOMILY OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS

St Peter's Basilica

Holy Thursday, 28 March 2014

"The eyes of all at the synagogues were fixed on him" (Lk 4:21). This passage of the Gospel is striking. It always makes us remember that account of those who were present when Jesus was on trial, in a moment of wonder and bewilderment. We know, however, what happened next. After Jesus had revealed the false importance of his townspeople, they were "filled with rage" (Lk 4:28), got up and drove him out of town. They had indeed looked upon Jesus, but their hearts were not prepared to change of his word. They lost the occasion of a lifetime.

Tonight, Holy Thursday, will offer us a very different exchange of looks. It involves Peter, the first Pastor of our Church. Peter too initially refused to accept the "surprising" words that the Lord had spoken to him: "You will deny me three times" (Mt 16:27). As a result, he "fainted" of fear and denied him at the Lord's door. Then, however, "the Lord turned and blessed Peter" and he "recalled the word of the Lord... and went out and wept bitterly" (Lk 22:61-62). His eyes were flooded with tears that, rising up from a wounded heart, blessed him from his God's actions and his self-assurance. Those bitter tears changed him.¹⁰

Jesus' words and actions in the course of those years had an altered Peter's expectations, so similar to those of the people of Nazareth. He too was expecting a political Messiah, powerful, heroic and decisive. Standardized in the right of Jesus, powerless and submitting passively to his arrest, he said, "I do not know her!" (Lk 22:57). Like that other son, Peter did not know Jesus. He would only begin to know him when, at the dark moment of his denial, he would no longer be master of himself and free of consequences.

And he would know Jesus in truth when, "Then because Jesus said to him a third time, 'Do you love me?', he would let the Lord's gaze penetrate his entire being. Thus, from saying, 'I do not know her!', he was able to say, 'Lord, you know everything'" (Jn 21:17).

Dear brother priests, the healing of the heart of Peter, the healing of the apostle, the healing of the pastor, consciousness, grief-stricken and repentant, he allowed himself to be forgivens by Jesus. That healing took place amid tears, bitter weeping, and the sorrow that leads to renewed life. For this reason, I have felt the need to share with you a few thoughts on an aspect of the spiritual life that has been somewhat neglected, yet crucially essential. Even the word I am going to use today is somewhat old-fashioned, yet well worthy of reflecting on. That word is compunction.

The origin of the term refers to do with penance. Compunction is "a pricking of the heart" that is painful and evokes tears of repentance. Here, as other episode from the life of Saint Peter can help us. His heart, having been pierced by Jesus' grace and his words, first, was purified and set alive by the Holy Spirit, proclaimed on the day of Pentecost to the inhabitants of Jerusalem: "God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified" (cf. Act 2:23). The hearts, recognizing both the evil that they had done and the salvation that the Lord was offering them, won themselves "out of the heart" (Act 2:37).

That is what compunction is: not a sense of guilt that makes us disengaged or alienated with our surroundings, but a beneficial "pricking" that purifies and heals the heart. Once we manage to run it, our hearts can be opened to the working of the Holy Spirit, the source of living water that wells up within us and brings Jesus to our eyes. Those who are willing to be "renovated" and let God's grace permeate their heart receive the gift of divine grace, the heart of waters after the rain of baptism. This is my desire for you, dear brother priests.

Yet we need to understand clearly what it means to weep for ourselves. It does not mean weeping in self pity, as we see so often respond to do. As, for example, when we are disappointed or upset that our desire is frustrated, when we feel misunderstood, perhaps even by our fellow priests and our superiors. Or when we take an odd and unusual pleasure in brooding over wrongs received, feeling sorry for ourselves convinced that we were not treated as we deserved or fearing that the future will hold further unpleasant surprises. This, as Saint Paul teaches us, is "worldly grief", as opposed to "Godly grief".

Weeping for ourselves, on the other hand, means sincerely repenting the offending God by our sins, recognising that we always remain in God's grace, accepting that we have enjoyed from the past, of holiness and fidelity to the love of the One who gave his life for us. [3] It means looking within and reflecting of our ingratitude and unthankfulness, and also concluding with sorrow our duplicity, dishonesty and hypocrisy. Clerical hypocrisy, dear brothers, is something we fall into all too often. We need to be attentive to this reality. And turning our gaze once more to the crucified and letting ourselves be touched by his love, which always forgives and raises up, even disappointing the best of those who hope in him. Thus thus well as and in flowing down our faces, descending finally our hearts.

Compassion demands effort, but becomes peace. It is not a source of temporary but of healing for the soul, thus leaving a hidden open the wounds of sin, propitiating or to receive the cures of the Lord, who transforms the "troubled, comforted heart" (Ps. 51:12), once it has been softened by grace. Compassion is thus the antidote to "scleroderma", that hardness of heart so often condemned by Jesus (cf. Mt. 5:9; 18:9). By without reservation and courage, the heart becomes light, it becomes still, impeded with problems and difficulties to progress, and then cold, impervious and impervious, God finally fails to touch. Yet journeys

traps of water can wear down a stone, as time can slowly soften every heart. In this way, a "good sorrow" ultimately leads to greatness.

Thus we can begin to see why the courses of the spiritual life focus on the importance of compassion. Saint Ignatius says that, "In times and growing daily we should continue in prayer to God the love of our soul", and observes that in prayer, "it is not by many words that we are greatly heard, but by our purity of heart and love of compassion". Saint John Chrysostom adds that a single man can distinguish a flock of ewes, while the Institution of Christ tells us: "Give yourself to compassion of sheep"; thus "through levity of heart and neglect of our divine charge, we do not fulfil the requests of our Lord". Compassion is the remedy. For this, again it brings us back to the truth about ourselves, so that the depths of our being always can reveal the infinitely greater beauty of our being professed by grace – the joy of being patient. It is not surprising, then, that Isaac of Nineveh could say: "The one who forgoes the greatest of his sins accepts the greatest of God's mercy as his reward".

To be sure, dear brothers and sisters, all interior renewal is born of the encounter between one human misery and God's mercy, and it develops through poverty of spirit, which allows the Holy Spirit to enrich us. Thus too, we can think of the clear teaching of many spiritual masters, including, once again, Saint Isaac: "Those who acknowledge their sins... are greater than those who by their penance save the dead. Those who weep for all hour over their sins are greater than those who serve the whole world by contemplation... Those ones blessed with self-knowledge are greater than those blessed with the vision of angels".

Bolder points let us look to ourselves and ask ourselves what part compassion and tears play in our estimation of consequence and our prayers. Let us ask whether, with the years

that pass, our many iniquities. In nature, the older we become, the more we sleep. In the life of the spirit, however, we are asked to become like children (cf. Mt 18:3): "You shall be wise, as a reed and grow old within, whereas those whose prayer becomes simpler and deeper, grounded in pliancy and wonder in the presence of God, grow and mature. They become like ones attached to themselves and more attached to Christ. Made poor in spirit, they draw closer to the peace, love which is dear to God. As Saint Bonaventure of Arsia wrote so eloquently, those whom we used to keep at a distance are becoming our dear companions. So it is that those who feel compassion of heart are seeking for themselves brothers and sisters to all the saints of the world, setting aside of superiority and harsh judgments, and filled with a burning desire to save lives and make reputation.

Dear brothers, another aspect of cooperation is solidarity. A heart that is facile, lured by the spirit of the flesh, becomes naturally prone to greater compassion towards others. Rather than feeling anger and scandal at the failings of our brothers and sisters, it yearns for their sins. There occurs a sort of reversal, where the natural tendency to be inimical with ourselves and inimicable with others is overturned and, by God's grace, we become most with ourselves and merciful towards others. The Lord writes, above all, to those co-operating in his law, men and women who form the soul of the Church and the world, and because intercessions are behalf of all. Dear young heroic witnesses in the Church have shown us this way. We think of the needs of the desert in East and West, the eastern monasteries, St Ignatius and Ignatius of Loyola, the Franciscans of the Conquest of Love, and then many priests who, like the Card. of Ars, said lives of penance for the salvation of others. Dear brothers, this is not party, but priesthood.

Dear brother priests, from us, like shepherds, the Lord demands not hardness but love, and love for those who have strayed. If

and the lack of truth that we encounter daily will make us respond not with consternation, but with perturbation and anxiety. How greatly we need to be set free from hardness and intransigence, solidness and obstinacy, rigidity and inflexibility, in order to extend ourselves completely to God, and to find in him the solace that delights us from the depths, rousing a clamour and fear in purity, introspection and deep tears for collapse; in this way, we will allow the Lord to work his wonders. And Jesus has said, "He who will surely prosper me!"

Our ministry will help in this. Today, in our secular societies, we run the risk of being hyperactive and at the same time feeling inadequate, with the result that we lose motivation and we impel to "pull up the oars", to take refuge in complaining and we forget that God is infinitely greater than all our problems. When that happens, we become bitter and prideful, always backbiting and complaining about things. Whereas if bitterness and complaint are directed not to the world but to our own hearts, the Lord will not fail to visit us and raise us up. That is exactly what the Ignatians of Our Lady tell us to do: "Put yourself not above the affairs of others, and do not become entangled in the business of other people. Set your eye constantly on yourself, and admonish yourself instead of your friends. If you do not enjoy the favour of men, do not let it sadden you; yet consider it a certain comfort if you do not confide yourself as well as reasonably to other people."

Lastly, let me emphasize another essential point: cooperation is not an end in itself but a goal, and as such it must be sought imprecise. Reparation to God's gift and the work of the Holy Spirit. As an aid to enhancing a spirit of repentence, I would share two bits of advice. First, let us stop looking at our life and our vocation in terms of efficiency and measurable results, and being caught up in pressure and closed expectation, instead let us view things against the greater horizons of the past and the future.

marked of his longevous and firmly anchored in his love. The Spirit, by linking to the eternal goal to which we are called, the ultimate purpose of our lives. Broadening our horizons, our borders, helps to expand our hearts, to spend time with the Lord and to experience communion. My spiritual advice follows from the first. Let us endevour to cultivate prayer that is not obligatory and functional, but freely chosen, tranquil and prolonged. Brothers, how is your prayer like? Let us return to silence. Have you been longing to adore the Lord? Let us return to the prayer of the heart. Let us repeat Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. Let us leave God's guidance over us as we contemplate our own sinfulness, and open our hearts to the healing power of his grace. Then we will endevour the salvation of Syro-Malabar Church in having our prayer always begin in the words of the psalmist who says God, come to my assistance!

Dear brothers, allow me to conclude by referring to Saint Peter and his trial. The day we are above his tomb makes us think of how often we priests – who daily say: "Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you" – have disappointed and grieved the One who loved us so greatly to formate our bonds the instruments of his presence. We do well, then, to open these prayers we say in silence: "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, Lord", and "With me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me thoroughly". Yet in every way, brothers, we are concluded by the certainty spoken of in today's liturgy: the Lord, consecrated by his anointing (cf. Lk 4:18), came "to heal up the brokenhearted" (Is 61:1). If hearts are broken, surely they can be bound up and healed by Jesus. Thank you, dear priests, for your open and docile hearts. Thank you for all your hard work and your times. Thank you for bringing the mite of God's mercy. Always forgive. Be merciful. Bring God's mercy to our brothers and sisters in today's world. Dear priests, may the Lord console you, strengthen you and reward you. Thank you!

PASTORAL LETTER

The Major Archibishop of the Syro-Malabar Church,
To the Archbishops, Bishops, Priests, Consecrated Men and Women
and lay Friends of the Syro-Malabar Church.
May the Grace of the Lord be with you all!

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ,

I am addressing you for the first time through this pastoral letter after assuming the Office of the Major Archibishop of the Syro-Malabar Church. The First Session of the XXII Synod of Bishops, held at the Major Archibepiscopal Curia of the Syro-Malabar Church, Mount St. Thomas Kallianad from 5 to 10 January 2024, elected me the Major Archbishop and His Holiness Pope Francis confirmed the election. I was enthroned as the Major Archbishop on 11 January. I take this occasion to express my gratitude to the whole Church, for having prayed for the election of the new Major Archbishop. I also express my deep appreciation and gratitude to Mr. Sebastian Visagopan Iyer, the Confrat Brother, who being the Administrator of the Church oversaw the Synod and coordinate everything regarding the election and enthronement meeting institution and goes till date.

The history of the Syro-Malabar Church is a miraculous story of Divine intervention. This community which was born from the missionary work of St. Thomas, the Apostle, had to pass through several horrifying instances of suffering and complicated situations down through the centuries. This community, which overcame the temptations to be separated from the Catholic community, continued to live their call to faith and fidelity

its self-identity. Thus through the Syro-Malabar Hierarchy was established in 1923, all the canonical structures were developed only in 1992 when the Syro-Malabar Church was elevated to the Major Archiepiscopal Status. We should thank the Providence which guided our Church in the last two thousand years. On this occasion, I do remember in a special way the devoted service of His Beatitude Cardinal Mar Akyrios Eusebius, the first Major Archbishop, His Grace Mar Abraham Kallanam, the Pastoral Delegate, and His Beatitude Cardinal Mar Vinkay Vilimcottil, the second Major Archbishop of our Church.

The services of His Beatitude Cardinal Mar George Alencherry, the third Major Archbishop of our Church, are unparalleled and unique. His life is marked with simplicity, pure love for the Church, unswerving commitment to the Gospel and Indian soul. His brought and led the Syro-Malabar Church to gain all-India jurisdiction and to get eparchies established in Melbourne, Mauritius, Great Britain, and the Apostolic Vicariate in Europe, giving our Church a global dimension. It was his determination and single-mindedness that made possible the uniform code of celebration of the Holy Qurbana and the revision of the Liturgy of the Hours, at a time when the efforts for the liturgical reforms were almost complicated in our Church. We offer our gratitude to His Beatitude for his selfless commitment for the good of the Church.

His Holiness Pope Francis, in his letter confirming my election, asked me to care for the poor and the marginalized. Jesus identified himself with those who were deprived of food, water, clothing, shelter, land of their own, and freedom (Mt. 25:35-36). We must take every effort to live Pope Francis' vision, "the Church of the poor". Extravagance, luxury and corruption display an irony against the Gospels. The down-to-simplicity that Jesus had at heart His Church should be reflected in all areas of the Church activities. The simplicity of the Gospels should be the modus operandi of all our celebrations, connected with parish feast,

marriages, ordinations and our vocations. Any institution that is not accessible to the poor has no right to be known as an institution of the Church.

We have to consciously aware of the discrimination that is being experienced by the Christians in Kenya and in India as a whole. We have to promote and protect all the constitutional provisions that guarantee the growth and development of our community as a minority group. Parishes, unorganized laborers and small-scale traders are all neglected in all sectors. As the government is failing to protect the lives of the people in the tribal areas of Kenya, many tribes and their land-claims work are lost on account of the attacks of wild animals. In all these cases, organized movements in a democratic way are becoming essential.

We should never forget that Christians are always the spokespeople of religious harmony. We believe that the reconciliation that we brought about by Jesus is still there. There is no place for racism or separation in Christian life. We have to work with great care not to lose the harmony and fraternal relationship with different religions.

The blessings that our Church has received from God are manifold. There are more than 50 bishops of faithful in 25 Eparchies, Apostolic Vicariate in Europe and in other unorganized communities. Also, the Church is blessed with many vocations to priesthood and to consecrated life. We are proud of our priests and consecrated persons who serve not only in our parishes and institutions but also in other Churches and around the world. The Church wants her priests and religious to use their pastoral spiritual perspective in order to render their service more effectively and live living the brightness of priesthood and consecrated life by the human shortcomings and prayer difficulties levels. The ten-fold blessings of our Church are more strongly felt by their families. Our parishes in large and small, impact our families and families the other sectors of life.

The faith life of our youth and children is the blessing of the Lord in our Church. We have to walk with the youth and strengthen them to confront the challenges they face in life. The faith formation of the youths and children should be considered the responsibility of the whole Church. Our youth and children must grow in their awareness to accept Jesus as Lord and Saviour in their own lives and to profess it before others. The faith formation should be focused on the goal.

God has blessed the Syro-Malabar Church abundantly to imbibe the missionary character of the Universal Church in all its dimensions. We have to remember in our prayers all our missionaries who work in our mission stations and the other mission areas. We know that there are organised attempts to drive out our missionaries by levelling baseless allegations and filing cases against them who work in many developed areas in India by establishing schools, orphanages and clinics in such areas, providing compassionate care and sufficient love. The whole Church has to pray for those missionaries who are being persecuted for the sake of Christ. Let us not forget that it is the duty of each one of us to give all possible support to their activities in the mission areas.

The Church in India is facing another phase of migration. The youth and young families are migrating to foreign lands for higher education, better job opportunities and higher standard of life. The agencies in India should join with the agencies abroad to accompany the individuals and families who migrate and to give assistance to them. There are instances when the economic or developmental concern of the type of education or jobs offered to them below living India. I would urge all concerned to examine the cases of the young who leave their mother country immediately after the Plus Two and the tendency of placing a heavy debt burden on the families in order to send the children abroad. We should exploit the possibility for the opportunities for higher education and jobs in India itself.

God is opening new horizons before the Syro-Malabar Church. We should never forget that the greatest need of the Church is faith and conversion. We should be guided by the vision of St. Pope John XXIII that is the growth and development of every individual Church, the忠fulness to the traditions (consecutiveness) as well as the openness to renewal (reformism) are of prime importance. Traditionality and flexibility are complementary to each other and therefore we should not approach them as causes of division. We should remember that it is the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ, that has always succeeded when such strong headed people throw accusations against one another through social media.

I am sure that you are aware of the article existing in the Archeparchy of Thrissur and Angamaly regarding the implementation of the uniform code of discipline of the Holy Qurbana. Let us pray fervently and work together to fulfil this vision in our Church. The Apostolic See has appointed Archbishop Cyril Vassif SI, the Pontifical Delegate and Bishop Mar Baselios Pater, the Apostolic Administrator, to fulfil a mission to this episcopate. All are requested to cooperate with them in their effort to maintain unity in our Church. Nobody can step back and from the repeated exhortations given by the Holy Father to implement the decisions of the Synod on the uniform code of discipline. We have to remain in the co-operation of the Catholic Church by living faithfully in the Holy Father.

Dearly beloved, I place my best in your prayers. Faith and love as the Lord entrusted me with the responsibility of shepherding the Syro-Malabar Church. Even when we pass through difficulties, we should have the deep faith that "He never abandons his sheep like us. Although he disciplines us with calamities, He does not forsake His own people" (1 Macc. 6:18). The words of Jesus "you did not choose me, but I chose you" (Jn. 15: 16) strengthens us. May the deep conviction of St. Paul

(1 Thess. 5:24) make us bold! As the children of the Syro-Malabar Church, which is one among the Eastern Churches in turn, let us consider in love and unity to give the witness which our love demands from us in communion with the Universal Church and in fidelity to the Holy Father. I commend all of you to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the intercession of St. Thomas the Apostle, our Father in Faith. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all!

Born on 13 November 1937 at Muthukara, Pala Diocese, Kerala, Sr. Rose completed her earthly sojourn and left for eternity on 17 March 2004. She was the M/o of St. Michael's Pds. N. I. Cook and Treasurer, Neermalki. She joined the SD Congregation following the inspiring example of her mother Superior Mother Agnes SD and two aunts late Mother Savitri SD.

The patients were highly impressed of her gentle dialogue and compassionate service with a smiling face. She lived her motto "To serve the sick and destitute" by her round the clock service. This radiant soul was blooming wonderfully with high positive energy, determination, simplicity, diligence, cheerfulness, approachability, deep spiritual life and a profound spirit of goodness.

She was diagnosed with lung cancer at fourth stage in 2002. She was courageous enough to face it with strong will-power and high positive energy. As her health was deteriorating, for the last few months she was at Adishthan Hospital Woor. At her ultimate goal approached, on 14 March 2004 she was given Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion by Rev. Fr. Mathew Marigopal parish priest Woor. 

DECREE OF PROMULGATION

In the Name of Christ Power and Blessing to

The Parish, the Religious and the faithful of the Eparchy of Chanda.

The Kingdom Came!

The eparchy of Chanda officially attained its existence as an 'Uttaradit' on 21 March 1992. It was established as an archiconvent in 1968 and as an eparchy in 1977. Christian and Dispensary, the first venture in health ministry started in 1966, and it became a full-fledged hospital in 1984. Gradually more health ministry institutions started in different parts under the aegis of eparchy and by different religious Congregations. Due to various reasons in the course of time some of the health service entities have to be closed down. Currently we have four hospitals and five dispensaries in the eparchy, besides health services are rendered in different ways in the towns and in the villages.

For an effective health service in the Eparchy of Chanda, the curia held on 24/11/2013 has decided to appoint a Management Committee to monitor health operations in the eparchy. The joint governing body meeting of both hospitals - Christian and Chanda, held on 28-12-2013 has agreed at the decision of the curia with regard to the appointment of a Management Committee for the purpose mentioned above. The entire meeting of all the members of the newly constituted Management Committee held on 9 March 2014 ratified the By-Laws and decided to go ahead functioning of the Committee with effect from 1 April 2014. Hence, I promulgate these By-Laws of

Management Committee for Health Services w.e.f. 1 April 2014, for the better functioning of health services within territorial jurisdiction of the Eparchy of Chanda.

— BY-LAWS —

The following are the By-Laws for the management Committee for health services in the eparchy of Chanda. It is meant for smooth functioning of all hospitals and dispensaries in territorial jurisdiction of the Eparchy of Chanda in mutual support and collaboration. The director shall co-ordinate all activities of the committee for the betterment of every member institution for common good and to implement the health policy of the Church in different levels. The director shall be a liaison officer between member institutions and the apocryphal curia.

The Bishop shall appoint the committee with a director with executive powers to implement the directives of the curia in the hospitals and dispensaries and to co-ordinate the health services run by Religious Congregations within the Eparchy as per these By-Laws.

1. **Purpose:** The committee is meant to manage the eparchical hospitals and dispensaries and to coordinate the health services of the religious Congregations in the eparchy effectively and in mutual collaboration.

2. **Committee Members:** The members shall be chosen by the Bishop in consultation with the curia. There shall be seven members who are experts in different fields such as medicine, administration, accounting, law, construction etc. The members of the committee shall be Director of the Diocesan Hospitals and

the Coordinator of health services in the Eparchy of Chaudh. The term of the committee will be for five years. It may be extended as required. Every decision of the committee shall be ratified by the Bishop before it is implemented. The members shall be of three categories: Appointed members, Ex-officio members and invited members. Appointed members are permanent while invited members attend the meetings only on invitation. The administration of the four hospitals in the eparchy will be the ex-officio members of the committee. Exports may be invited as guest members for any meeting as required. The quorum of the committee shall be simple majority. The quorum is decided from the presence of the appointed members and ex-officio members.

3. Director: coordinate (Convenor): He shall convene the meetings and coordinate all activities of the Committee meetings shall be convened not less than once a year. Director is to do everything after the resolution in the committee and in the eparchia. He shall implement every decision through the respective administration or after having consulted them as required. He also supervises every diocese to implement the decisions of the committee for diocesan institutions. He shall be only a coordinator for other health services within the jurisdiction of the Eparchy of Chaudh.

4. Functions of the Committee:

- 4.1 General: (applicable to all health services within the territorial properties of the eparchy of Chaudh)
 - 4.1.1 Coordination of medical services within the Eparchy of Chaudh.
 - 4.1.2 Ensure purchase of medicines and medical equipment as required.
 - 4.1.3 Dosing of the hospital staff using the medical tools in the diocese as required.
 - 4.1.4 Any concrete ventures such as medical camp, celebrations, occasions, health services in pandemic

- 4.1.5 Financial representation in higher ecclesiastical bodies such as Synod of Bishops, CBCI, WCC, CHAI, Catechism.
- 4.2. Particular: (Applicable to the health services owned and maintained by the eparchy of Chaudh)
 - 4.2.1 Arrange regular internal audit of the eparchical hospitals and dispensaries.
 - 4.2.2 Periodical visits of the eparchical hospitals and dispensaries.
 - 4.2.3 Approval of appointments, disciplinary actions, reduction of rank, suspension, demotion etc. of the staff of eparchical health centers (Hospitals and dispensaries).
 - 4.2.4 Assessing coordination between the administrators of eparchical hospitals in Chaudh in case of collaboration.
 - 4.2.5 Responsible for examination of diocesan hospitals and dispensaries.
 - 4.2.6 Create joint collaboration among eparchical health centers under the territorial properties of Chaudh.
 - 4.2.7 See that the common procurement of the diocesan hospitals and dispensaries.
 - 4.2.8 Give approval for any renovation, construction of hospital buildings or alteration of hospital facilities of the diocesan hospitals costing more than one lakh rupees having consulted in the diocesan council.
 - 4.2.9 Meet with the administrators of the eparchical hospitals every month and report the findings to the bishop/Cards.
 - 4.2.10 See that the hospitals provide safe and quality patient care, treatments and services in accordance with laws, rules and regulations of the government and church council.
 - 4.2.11 Arrange the internal audit of the diocesan hospitals twice a year and it wholly recommended to involve in outside

agency for the next four years/year.

- 4.2.12 Any donation/contribution from episcopal hospitals to any other institution within the diocese or outside shall be done with only the approval of the Director.
- 4.2.13 Any project application shall be forwarded to episcopal ranks only with the consent of the Director.
- 4.2.14 The director shall have a day in episcopal hospitals and dispensaries to note down his comments and suggestions during his visit to such institutions.
- 4.2.15 The director shall be the co-signatory for the accounts of the episcopal Hospitals.
- 4.2.16 The director shall arrange the welfare committee (privilege committee) to meet with the staff in group or individually at least once a year.

5. Conclusion
