PROLIFE SUNDAY

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and my dear people,

Thy Kingdom Come!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Holy Mother Church observes every year Prolife Sunday in January. In connection with the “Year of Sanctity of Life” we shall observe it in the diocese on 21 September Sunday 2025 in the month when we celebrate the feast of Nativity of Mary our Mother. I exhort everyone to celebrate it in every parish and institution befittingly. It is not just a question of respect and love for life but it is also recognition of dignity of human life which is solely a gratuitous gift of God. The fifth commandment of God “Thou shall not kill” (Ex. 20:13) bans any form or practice of voluntarily taking away of life – abortion, murder, euthanasia, suicide, capital punishment etc. The Declaration on Human Dignity, promulgated by Holy See in April 2024 asserts; “The dignity of every human being has an intrinsic character and is valid from the moment of conception until natural death” (# 47). The Declaration continues, “The acceptance of abortion in the popular mind in behavior and even in law itself is a telling sign of an extremely dangerous crisis of the moral sense which is becoming more and more incapable of distinguishing between good and evil, even when the fundamental right to life is at stake” (#47).

On medical assistance in dying, the Declaration says: “There is a widespread notion that euthanasia or assisted suicide is somehow consistent with respect for the dignity of the human person. However, in response to this, it must be strongly reiterated that suffering does not cause the sick to lose their dignity which is intrinsically and inalienably their own” (# 51).

We must take every opportunity to proclaim the sacred value of human life by prayerful intercession, by witnessing to others and

supporting organizations whose goal it is to help those facing tensions of crisis. Ours is the voice of truth about life to our family, friends and the wider community. Let us ask the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mother of life to guide in our efforts to increase reverence for life and culture of life in our world.

Respect of life refers to the idea of human life being sacred, holy and precious. It is inherent as man is incapable of creating life and therefore, people have no right to take their own lives or those of others. The respect of life or the sanctity of life is usually often contrasted and conflicted with “quality of life” to some extent, is the foundation on which all catholic teachings about the fifth commandment in the Decalogue are built. The right to life comes up in debates about capital punishment, abortion, euthanasia, suicide and 'just' and unjust wars.

As we have set apart 2025 as the Year of Sanctity of Life, I exhort everyone in the diocese to observe some of the following befittingly so as to create an awareness of Sanctity of Life among our people and in the society:

- i) Pro-life Sunday in parishes – Homily on the theme.
- ii) Pro-life Day in schools.
- iii) March for life – Rally in parish level and in schools.
- iv) Sanctity of Life awareness in hospitals + dispensaries.
- v) Respect for life drawing competition – for catechism children.
- vi) Day for unborn babies.
- vii) Day for the sick.
- viii) Day for grandparents and elderly.
- ix) Mothers' Day.
- x) Fathers' Day.
- xi) Family Day.
- xii) Environment Day – Respect for all forms of life.
- xiii) Animals Day – Blessing of Animals etc.

These observances may guide our people to build up a strong society where there is mutual respect, seeking welfare of one another and deep awareness of our participating role in divine life. We shall resolve to make conscious efforts to create awareness of dignity of life

among our faithful and others. Kindly do needful to curtail any tendency of voluntary termination of human life in any form. Cherish and nourish a dignified life to every human person in whatever way possible. May God bless everyone.

MISSION SUNDAY

Dear Fathers, Brothers, Sisters and the Faithful,

Thy Kingdom Come!
Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Once again mission Sunday is around the corner. This year it falls on 19 October 2025. May I share some reflections on Mission Sunday to fortify our missionary commitment. The great command of Jesus to the disciples is the foundation stone of Christ's mission in the world. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt. 28:19-20).

The origin of mission Sunday can be traced back to the early 20th century. The idea of a universal mission awareness day was first proposed by Pope Pius XI in 1926, during a period when the Church was increasingly focusing on global outreach. The Holy Father's encyclical, *Rerum Ecclesiae*, urged for a collective effort in supporting the Church's missions. This initiative culminated in the establishment of Mission Sunday in 1926, aiming to create a specific day each year to encourage prayer, reflection and financial support for missionary work. World Mission Day established by Pope Pius XI in 1926 aims to foster a sense of global solidarity in Church's mission to evangelize. It is a day dedicated to create awareness, prayers and financial support for missionary work. The observance underscores the need for Catholics worldwide to embrace their role in the Church's mission supporting the efforts to spread the Gospel and serve those in need.

World Mission Day assumes a unique significance in the Indian context as we reflect the diversity of religions and cultural traditions. The multifaceted spiritual landscape presents both challenges and opportunities for missionary work. The primary goal of missionary work is proclamation of Good News - "the kingdom of God is at hand

repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mk. 1:15). By signs and wonders it shall be confirmed (Cf. Acts 2:43, 5:12). Thus the disciples witnessed their Christ's representative mission by their love and service. By your love everyone shall know that you are my disciples (Jn. 13:35). Somehow in our context today our mission is misinterpreted as works oriented only for baptism. Though we do not exclude baptism, we do not exclusively mean baptism either. It is the work of the Holy Spirit and with the full consent of the person concerned. To evoke faith in a person there should be internal disposition. Indeed Holy Mother Church categorically denounces forced baptism and wooing anyone through material benefits. However the invitation to the divine banquet (Mt. 22:1-14) becomes poignant as the Church seeks to engage with, and serve vast and varied populations.

The World Mission Day reminds every baptized person his/her mission to evangelize by word and deed. Strengthening local mission in education, healthcare and social justice make a tangible impact even today. Fostering global solidarity by our support in cash and kind reinforces the idea that the mission of the Church is universal. World Mission Day inspire the youth empowering them to take an active role in spreading the Gospel and serving their communities. Praying for missionaries provide strength and guidance for all those who are in the forefront of the missions. We shall do our customary practices of prayers, acts of charity, helping the sick and elderly, mission Sunday auction etc. with more earnestness and enthusiasm. World Mission Day offers a profound opportunity for reflection and action, particularly in the diverse and dynamic context of India. With good wishes and prayers,



ARREST OF TWO ASMI SISTERS AND ITS
AFTERMATH

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

"For it is better, if it is God's will, to suffer for doing good than for doing evil". (1 Pet. 3:17)

The arrest of two ASMI Sisters – Sr. Vandana Francis and Sr. Preethy Mary, raised great hue and cry in Kerala and few other parts of our country. In the Parliament also the issue was raised and took place very heated discussion. The Bishops, Priests, Brothers, Sisters, lay leaders and great number of people from Christian communities irrespective of affiliations have come out in street, particularly in Kerala to protest against the arrest and hippocritic acts of anti-Christian movements and police. They criticised thoroughly the double standard of Chhattisgarh government in the whole issue. The sincerity of the Sisters was very clear in the whole episode and the alleged accusations such as attempt of forced conversion and human trafficking have no base whatsoever, for, the girls involved in the issue are adults, they are already Christians for few years, they voluntarily decided to go for job in Agra with the consent of their parents and they had to give wrong witness under force and physical attack. These things have come to light in detailed investigation and the girls and their parents have divulged it before media. It is very clear that some hidden agendas of anti-Christian movements have worked behind to target Christian missionaries which has been prevalently active in our country for few years especially under the present political regime of our country. The whole episode once again invites us to be prudent like serpents (Mt. 10:16) in marching ahead in our missionary endeavours. We cannot water down our

mission. We are called to be missionaries (Mt. 28:19-20), while being responsible citizens of our country, observing civil laws and respecting all religious faiths, cultures, customs and people all over. Church does not endorse forced conversion. However, we demand the individual freedom of everyone to profess and propagate the religious faith of one's own choice. It is our constitutional right.

When the whole issue is analysed objectively we could see from the very first responses that we have received in the aftermath of the Sisters' arrest was that it could have been settled amicably as there wasn't anything wrong from the part of the Sisters concerned and they are indeed innocent. But the evil intentions of the anti-Christian movements have absurdly turned the issue upside down to curry their favours. It is very clear from the confession of the girls and their parents. The anti-Christian outfits have threatened the girls to give witness against the Sisters. Otherwise they could have got bail in couple of days. My enquiry from the concerned I got the impression that the Sisters would be released in couple of days as they are innocent and alleged accusations are baseless. Indeed, everyone expected that. But things turned other way around. At least in this late hours we shall show our solidarity with our beloved Sisters in their innocent suffering for the mission of the Church. Now we are happy that they are granted bail. We shall continue our prayers for the Sisters and we shall stand with ASMI General, Provincial Superior and the Sisters' family members in their grief and mental agony.

The crux of the issue lies in the ignorance of those girls that the Chhattisgarh State Legislative Assembly enacted a law in 2013 – Private Placement Regulation Act, which requires everyone who migrate to another district or State for any purpose should register their names in a Government portal online. The girls have not done it and the Sisters were unaware about it. Indeed, this law was enacted in the State for the protection of the people, in particular the tribal youth, who move out from native villages in search of job elsewhere in the State and country. In fact the Maoist activities in the State have necessitated such a law in the State. Besides, the entry of these girls to Durg railway

station without valid documents and train tickets added fuel to fire. The Sisters cannot be blamed for such pitfalls. Lack of caution and ignorance from the part of girls might have resulted in such helpless situation. Hidden agendas of some miscreants have manoeuvred the situation shrewdly to target Christian missionaries. They availed the opportunity and worked out 'well' to trap the Sisters. This was not a first instance, there have been many such instances in the past.

Now it is a great relief for all of us that the two Sisters confined behind bars in Chhattisgarh jail is bailed out. We shall stand with the Sisters in their ordeal that they had to undergo in prison for almost nine days. As they are our co-missionaries we are duty-bound to stand with them and support them showing our concern, compassion and communion as they are also the members of the Mystical Body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:12-31).


Anyhow we shall learn some lessons for future from these incidents. We shall take more caution when we extent help to others for job placement in our institutions. And also meticulous care is required when we recruit youths/students for formation or higher studies. Everyone is requested to follow the guidelines as given below for our safety and good of the Church.

- 1) Make sure that everyone always carry valid ID Documents.
- 2) It is highly recommended that parents or siblings of candidates accompany them to the destination.
- 3) Avoid that Priests, Brothers or Sisters accompany the candidates for job, studies or formation.
- 4) In all cases get from the concerned the consent forum duly filled and signed as required, both from the parents and the candidates for job placement, formation/studies.
- 5) In the case of job placement keep ready in advance the agreement form duly signed by the concerned for salary and for other provisions.
- 6) More caution is required when anyone below 18 years is recruited for formation.

I request everyone to pay attention to these guidelines.

Though we have cancelled the scheduled prayer and protest rally, may I request everyone to have a prayer session or adoration tomorrow Sunday 3rd August 2025 in all our parishes and institutions immediately after Holy Qurbana to express our solidarity with the Sisters. Kindly explain to the people the context of this circular so as to create an awareness among them about anti-Christians activities and atrocities against Christian missionaries. Please fortify our people's faith to witness Christ in words and deeds. We shall pray for those two Sisters, their family members and for all the missionaries in the world. God bless everyone.





Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost was elected as the 267th pope of the Roman Catholic Church becoming the first pope from the United States. The sixty-nine-year-old prelate chose the papal name "Leo" as he was inspired by pope Leo XIII, who addressed social issues during the First Industrial Revolution through the 1891 encyclical *Rerum Novarum*. Two-days later after his election, in his first meeting with the cardinals, he announced his intention to further develop the Catholic Church's social doctrine, emphasising the principles of human dignity, solidarity and common good, continuing the legacy of his predecessor, Pope Francis. He said that the new industrial revolution and



developments in Artificial Intelligence are posing new threats for the defence of human dignity, justice and labour. Pope Leo XIV underscored that the Church continues to offer its social tradition to confront these contemporary challenges. During his meeting with the cardinals Pope Leo also asked them to renew their complete commitment to the major reforms enacted by the Second Vatican Council in the 1960s which included celebrating the Mass in local languages rather than Latin and pursuing dialogue with other religious.

Pope Leo XIV election reflects his leadership and dedication within the Church hierarchy, marking a significant milestone in the Church's global evolution. His journey – from humble Chicago roots to global leadership – reflects his commitment to compassion and peace. Pope Leo appeared on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, he greeted the world with a heartfelt message: "peace be with all of you". On May 28, during the General Audience, Pope Leo XIV addressed a powerful message to the international community and all believers on the importance of compassion and the urgency of peace. He exhorted humanity to practice active compassion and to seek peace during current conflicts, especially in Ukraine and Gaza, reminding us that helping one's neighbour is an act of humanity that transcends all religions.



Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples

Dear brothers and sisters!

For World Mission Day in the Jubilee Year 2025, the central message of which is hope (cf. Bull *Spes Non Confundit*, 1), I have chosen the motto: “Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples”. It reminds individual Christians and the entire Church, the community of the baptized, of our fundamental vocation to be, in the footsteps of Christ, messengers and builders of hope. I trust that it will be for everyone a time of grace with the faithful God who has given us new birth in the risen Christ “to a living hope” (cf. 1 Pet 1:3-4). Here, I would like to mention some relevant aspects of our Christian missionary identity, so that we can let ourselves be guided by the Spirit of God and burn with holy zeal for a new evangelizing season in the Church, which is sent to revive hope in a world over which dark shadows loom (cf. *Fratelli Tutti*, 9-55).

1. In the footsteps of Christ our hope

Celebrating the first Ordinary Jubilee of the Third Millennium after that of the Holy Year of 2000, we keep our gaze fixed on Christ, the centre of history, “the same yesterday and today and forever” (Heb 13:8). In the synagogue of Nazareth, Jesus declared that Scripture was fulfilled in the “today” of his presence in history. He thus revealed that he is the One sent by the Father with the anointing of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom of God and to inaugurate “the year of the Lord’s favour” for all humanity (cf. Lk 4:16-21).

In this mystic “today”, which will last until the end of the world, Christ is the fullness of salvation for all, and in a particular way for those whose only hope is God. In his earthly life, “he went about doing good and healing all” from evil and the Evil One (cf. Acts 10:38), restoring hope in God to the needy and the people. He

experienced all our human frailties, save that of sin, even those critical moments that might lead to despair, as in the agony in the garden of Gethsemane and on the cross. Jesus commanded everything to God the Father, obediently trusting in his saving plan for humanity, a plan of peace for a future full of hope (cf. Jer 29:11). In this way, he became the divine Missionary of hope, the supreme model of all those down the centuries who carry out their own God-given mission, even amid extreme trials.

Through his disciples, sent to all peoples and mystically accompanied by him, the Lord Jesus continues his ministry of hope for humanity. He still bends over all those who are poor, afflicted, despairing and oppressed, and pours “upon their wounds the balm of consolation and the wine of hope” (Preface “Jesus the Good Samaritan”). Obedient to her Lord and Master, and in the same spirit of service, the Church, the community of Christ’s missionary disciples, prolongs that mission, offering her life for all in the midst of the nations. While facing persecutions, tribulations and difficulties, as well as her own imperfections and failures due to the weakness of her members, the Church is constantly impelled by the love of Christ to persevere, in union with him, on her missionary journey and to hear, like him and with him, the plea of suffering humanity and, indeed, the groaning of every creature that awaits definitive redemption. This is the Church that the Lord always and for ever calls to follow in his footsteps: “not a static Church, but a missionary Church that walks with her Lord through the streets of the world” (Homily at the Concluding Mass of the Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, 27 October 2024).

May we too feel inspired to set out in the footsteps of the Lord Jesus to become, with him and in him, signs and messengers of hope for all, in every place and circumstance that God has granted us to live. May all the baptized, as missionary disciples of Christ, make his hope shine forth in every corner of the earth!

2. Christians, bearers and builders of hope among all peoples

In following Christ the Lord, Christians are called to hand on the Good News by sharing the concrete life situations of those whom

they meet, and thus to be bearers and builders of hope. Indeed, “the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time, especially of those who are poor or afflicted, are the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the followers of Christ as well. Nothing that is genuinely human fails to find an echo in their hearts” (Gaudium et Spes 1).

This celebrated statement of the Second Vatican Council, which expresses the sentiment and style of Christian communities in every age, continues to inspire their members and helps them to walk with their brothers and sisters in the world. Here I think especially of those of you who are missionaries ad gentes. Following the Lord’s call, you have gone forth to other nations to make known the love of God in Christ. For this, I thank you most heartily! Your lives are a clear response to the command of the risen Christ, who sent his disciples to evangelize all peoples (cf. Mt 28:18-20). In this way, you are signs of the universal vocation of the baptized to become, by the power of the Spirit and daily effort, missionaries among all peoples and witnesses to the great hope given to us by the Lord Jesus. The horizon of this hope transcends the passing things of this world and opens up to those divine realities in which we share even now. Indeed, as Saint Paul VI observed, salvation in Christ, which the Church offers to all as a gift of God’s mercy, is not only “immanent, meeting material or even spiritual needs... completely caught up in temporal desires, hopes, affairs, and struggles. Rather, it exceeds all such limits in order to reach fulfilment in a communion with the one Absolute, which is God. It is a salvation both transcendent and eschatological, which indeed has its beginning in this life, but is fulfilled in eternity” (Evangelii Nuntiandi, 27).

Impelled by this great hope, Christian communities can be harbingers of a new humanity in a world that, in the most “developed” areas, shows serious symptoms of human crisis: a widespread sense of bewilderment, loneliness and indifference to the needs of the elderly, and a reluctance to make an effort to assist our neighbours in need. In the most technologically advanced nations, “proximity” is disappearing: we are all interconnected, but not related. Obsession with efficiency and an attachment to material things and ambitions are

making us self-centred and incapable of altruism. The Gospel, experienced in the life of a community, can restore us to a whole, healthy, redeemed humanity.

For this reason, I once more invite all of us to carry out the works mentioned in the Bull of Indiction of the Jubilee (Nos. 7-15), with particular attention to the poorest and weakest, the sick, the elderly and those excluded from materialistic and consumerist society. And to do so with God's "style": with closeness, compassion and tenderness, cultivating a personal relationship with our brothers and sisters in their specific situation (cf. *Evangelii Gaudium*, 127-128). Often they are the ones who teach us how to live in hope. Through personal contact, we will also convey the love of the

compassionate heart of the Lord. We will come to realize that "the heart of Christ... is the very core of the initial preaching of the Gospel" (*Dilexit Nos*, 32). By drawing from this source, we can offer with simplicity the hope we have received from God (cf. 1 Pet 1:21) and bring to others the same consolation with which we have been consoled by God (cf. 2 Cor 1:3-4). In the human and divine heart of Jesus, God wants to speak to the heart of every man and woman, drawing all of us to his love. "We have been sent to continue this mission: to be signs of the heart of Christ and the love of the Father, embracing the whole world" (Address to Participants in the General Assembly of the Pontifical Mission Societies, 3 June 2023).

3. Renewing the mission of hope

Faced with the urgency of the mission of hope today, Christ's disciples are called first to discover how to become "artisans" of hope and restorers of an often distracted and unhappy humanity.

To this end, we need to be renewed in the Easter spirituality experienced at every Eucharistic celebration and especially during the Easter Triduum, the centre and culmination of the liturgical year. We have been baptized into the redemptive death and resurrection of Christ, into the Passover of the Lord that marks the eternal springtime of history. Consequently, we are a "springtime people", brimming with hope to be shared with all, since in Christ "we believe and know

that death and hate are not the final word" pronounced on human existence (cf. Catechesis, 23 August 2017). From the paschal mysteries, made present in liturgical celebrations and in the sacraments, we constantly draw upon the power of the Holy Spirit in order to work with zeal, determination and patience in the vast field of global evangelization. "Christ, risen and glorified, is the wellspring of our hope, and he will not deprive us of the help we need to carry out the mission which he has entrusted to us" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 275). In him, we live and bear witness to that sacred hope which is "a gift from God and a task for Christians" (*Hope is a Light in the Night*, Vatican City 2024, 7).

Missionaries of hope are men and women of prayer, for "the person who hopes is a person who prays", in the words of Venerable Cardinal François-Xavier Van Thuan, who was himself sustained in hope throughout his lengthy imprisonment thanks to the strength he received from faithful prayer and the Eucharist (cf. *The Road of Hope*, Boston, 2001, 963). Let us not forget that prayer is the primary missionary activity and at the same time "the first strength of hope" (Catechesis, 20 May 2020).

So let us renew the mission of hope, starting from prayer, especially prayer based on the word of God and particularly the Psalms, that great symphony of prayer whose composer is the Holy Spirit (cf. Catechesis, 19 June 2024). The Psalms train us to hope amid adversity, to discern the signs of hope around us, and to have the constant "missionary" desire that God be praised by all peoples (cf. Ps 41:12; 67:4). By praying, we keep alive the spark of hope lit by God within us, so that it can become a great fire, which enlightens and warms everyone around us, also by those concrete actions and gestures that prayer itself inspires.

To conclude, evangelization is always a communitarian process, like Christian hope itself (cf. Benedict XVI, *Spe Salvi*, 14). That process does not end with the initial preaching of the Gospel and with Baptism, but continues with the building up of Christian communities through the accompaniment of each of the baptized along the path of the Gospel. In modern society, membership in the Church is never something achieved once for all. That is why the

missionary activity of handing down and shaping a mature faith in Christ is “paradigmatic for all the Church’s activity” (Evangelii Gaudium, 15), a work that requires communion of prayer and action. Here I would emphasize once more the importance of this missionary synodality of the Church, as well as the service rendered by the Pontifical Mission Societies in promoting the missionary responsibility of the baptized and supporting new Particular Churches. I urge all of you, children, young people, adults and the elderly, to participate actively in the common evangelizing mission of the Church by your witness of life and prayer, by your sacrifices and by your generosity. Thank you for this!

Dear sisters and brothers, let us turn to Mary, Mother of Jesus Christ our hope. To her we entrust our prayer for this Jubilee and for the years yet to come: “May the light of Christian hope illumine every man and woman, as a message of God’s love addressed to all! And may the Church bear faithful witness to this message in every part of the world!” (Bull Spes Non Confundit, 6).

- The Congregation of the Sisters of the Destitute came into existence in 1927 through the efforts of the Most Rev. Venerable Father Varghese Payyappilly, a diocesan priest of the Archdiocese of Ernakulam.
- In 1985, the Congregation was divided into three provinces: St. Mary's Province, Ernakulam; St. Vincent's Province, Kothamangalam; and St. Joseph's Province, Changanassery. Later, each province undertook its own mission areas in different parts of the country. Under the maternal care of St. Joseph's Province, the Krupadham Region — consisting of Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra - was raised to the status of a province in the year 2000.
- Today, Krupadham renders its sincere services in eight dioceses through twenty-one communities. Wherever we work and whatever we do, our prime concern is always the destitute.
- July 21st and 22nd, 2025, were red-letter days in the history of Krupadham. Sisters from all twenty-one communities gathered in Wardha. On the evening of the 21st, a solemn vigil conducted, and the melody of prayer filled the chapel.
