### SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of listening and dialoguing, which began with a solemn Eucharist in Rome on 10 October 2021. Each diocese was expected to begin the preparations on 17 October 2021. The synodal process would conclude in October 2023.

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality, which God expects of the Church of the third millennium."

This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's renewal proposed by Vatican II, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through her experience which processes can help her to live communion, to achieve participation and to open herself to the mission.

The Diocesan process for discerning the synodality was initiated by sending a circular to all the priests, the religious and the people of God. As a first step, it was decided to have a seminar-cum-workshop for all the priests and religious of our Diocese, which was held in three sitting on 4, 8 and 19 January 2022 for Thuckalay and Thenkasi regions. The Diocesan Synodal Committee, headed by Rev. Fr Thomas Sathianesan, Chancellor organized the seminar. Rev. Fr Maria Rajendran from Kuzhithurai Diocese delivered the first talk on Synodality and Rev. Fr Joshy Kulathumkal of our Diocese presentedthe10 nucleus themes on Synodality. After the two input sessions, the participants were divided into various groups and fruitful discussions on the given questions were held.





### **MISSION LEAGUE @ PLATINUM - INAUGURATION**

Cherupushpam Mission League (CML) is an indigenous pious organization for Catholic children founded at Bharanaganam in Kerala by Rev. Fr Joseph Maliparambil and Mr. P C Abraham Pallattukunnel (Kunjettan) under the saintly leadership of Mar James Kalassery, the then Bishop of Changanassery and the same was officially inaugurated by Mar Thomas Tharayil, Bishop of Kottayam on 3 October 1947. CML has St Theresa of Lisieux as its heavenly patroness and St. Thomas, St. Francis Xavier, and St. Alphonsa as its co-patrons. Pope Leo XIII prophesied that the salvation of India is in the hands of her children. Taking the words of the Holy Father as the motto, this pious association is meant for the lay apostolate in the various dioceses of India and many foreign countries.

The CML completes 75 years of its mission. The Platinum Jubilee is celebrated globally in all the Dioceses in the Syro-Malabar Church. The Platinum Jubilee was inaugurated in our Diocese on 2 January 2022. CML representatives, both students and animators from all the Foranes, were present for the program which was held at Padanthalumoodu. Rev. Fr Printo Kurias, Director



of CML, presented the actionplan prepared for our Diocese and called upon everyone to involve whole-heartedly in the celebrations and programs. The young members presented colorful cultural items to mark the occasion to the appreciation of all present.



### **FEAST OF DENHA**

Denha is the feast of the great revelation of Jesus as the light of the world. Jesus is the real Sun that dawned in the world through Incarnation. During the hidden life of Jesus in Nazareth, the public did not recognize him as the real Sun who illuminates the whole of humanity. He was manifested to the public by God the Father at his baptism. This feast is celebrated with great enthusiasm in the Syro-Malabar Church, exhibiting in many ways that God is the Light.

This great feast of Denha was celebrated on 6 January in all our Parishes. Taking inspiration from practices of the Catholics of northern Kerala, the Parishes observed as Pindiperunnal by decorating plantain trunks with lighted lamps. Special Holy Eucharistic was celebrated to remember the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus. It was encouraging to see that it was celebrated even in the Mission Stations with great enthusiasm.






# INAUGURATION OF LITTLE FLOWER SKILL TRAINING INSTITUTE

The Diocese of Thuckalay has been taking special efforts for the empowerment of the people at the local levels and in the entire region, understanding well the socio-economic status of the downtrodden. We entered into another important job-providing activity with the initiative of Rev. Fr Augustin Thalodilin, who has collaborated with the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India, set up a Skill Training Institute for Women at Little Flower Forane, Manjalumoodu. The official inauguration of the Centre was held on 5 January 2022. Nearly 80 women, young and old, joined the Centre to be trained in Tailoring, Embroidery, and Nursing. A Director has been appointed to look after the welfare of the Centre. We appreciate the initiative taken by Rev. Fr Augustin to give training and employment to the women of the area.









The 30<sup>th</sup> Major Archiepiscopal Synod of the Syro-Malabar Church began at Mt St Thomas, Kakkanad on 6 January 2022. His Beatitude Mar George Cardinal Alencherry, Head of the Syro-Malabar Church, led the Synod. A total of 57 Bishops, including those retired, took part. The Synod began with a recollection preached by Mar Thomas Thurithimattam. The Synodal sessions were held during 6 - 15 January 2022.

The main theme was the evaluation of the implementation of unified Holy Qurbana. There had been very difficult moments during the Synod, however, the hand of God had been felt throughout the deliberations and we do believe that the fruits will be seen as time passes by.

### **SOOSAIPURAM PARISH CELEBRATES DIAMOND JUBILEE**

The two-year Diamond Jubilee celebrations of St Joseph Parish, Soosaipuram came to an end on the evening of 6 January 2022. The day also marked the celebration of the Denha Feast and the conclusion of the year of St Joseph in the Parish. *Agal Vizhakku* was lit on the entire campus. Bishop Mar George Rajendran sdb was the main celebrant at the Holy Mass and the Chief Guest for the cultural program that followed. Rev. Fr Jebanesh, who belongs to this Parish, participated in the day's program. After the solemn Holy Mass, the Bishop distributed rosaries and the images of sleeping Joseph to all heads of the families.

The Holy Mass was followed by a cultural program. Its highlights were a song sung by 60 participants and dance with 60 dancers. The report of Diamond Jubilee's activities and celebrations was presented. The people who are married and settled in other parishes were invited to the program and images of St Joseph were gifted to them. Bishop congratulated the faithful, teachers, leaders, religious and priests for a

befitting celebration of the Diamond Jubilee of the establishment of the Parish. Bishop Mar George Rajendran sdb distributed the prizes for the Mega Bible Quiz conducted for the various categories of people and the Special Quiz on Our Blessed Mother Mary. *Kaikarar* (Church Leader), Mr. Rajamani delivered the vote of thanks. The celebrations ended with a sumptuous meal.

It may be recalled that St Joseph's Parish Soosaipuram was established on 4 December 1960 as the third Parish in the Kanyakumari Mission. It was the first Parish that Rev. Fr. Zacharias Kayathara established. The celebration of the Diamond Jubilee began on 19 March 2020 at the Feast of St Joseph. On that occasion, Bishop Mar George Rajendran SDB presided over the Holy Qurbana and released an action plan namely, *Nambikaiyal Puthuvazhvu Peruvom*, (Renewed Life with Hope). The 12 Uraviyum and other pious associations began the celebrations with great enthusiasm. But due to the pandemic, some of the activities were carried out online.



### **ONLINE PRIESTS' CONFERENCE**

We have been back again with the lockdown clamped with effect from 7 January 2022 by the Government of Tamil Nadu due to the spread of the third wave of Covid-19 and the closing of places of worship on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. To assess and to make alternative plans for the pastoral activities in the Diocese, a special priests' conference was called online on 6 January 2022. His Excellency Mar George Rajendran sdb led a discussion on the pastoral challenges that we have to encounter during the period of lockdown. Our responsibility was cut out to physical welfare, health, spiritual and pastoral

care of the people. After a brainstorming session, we solved that each parish/institution would take into consideration the spread of the epidemic in their respective areas and organize the spiritual activities in their institutions accordingly. It was decided that the parishes would offer the Sunday Holy Mass on one of the weekdays. Knowing the danger involved in coming together in large numbers, we cancelled the Diocese level Bible Fest and asked all Fathers to regularly conduct Catechism classes on weekdays. Now, we thank God that the third wave of the pandemic has not done too much damage and normalcy is returning.

It was a joyful and proud moment for our Diocese as the first position in the adult category was awarded to Mrs. Geetha from Sacred Heart Forane Church. Padanthalumoodu. In the student category, the third position was awarded to Anna S Rai from St Francis Parish, Mezhacode. His Excellency Mar George Rajendran sdb received the certificates and the cash prizes from the Major Archbishop. The Bishops congratulated and appreciated our Diocese for our active participation and for winning the prizes at the global level. We thank the Catechism department and all the participants and congratulate the winners.





### MCBS - 25 YEARS AT TENKASI MISSION

The Missionary Congregation of Blessed Sacrament (MCBS) Fathers began their educational mission at Sengottai in 1996 with the first missionary being Rev. Fr Thomas Poovathumngal MCBS. With some Syro-Malabar families, a quasi-parish was erected in the Diocese of Thuckalay. In 1999 Rev. Fr Roy Akathemattathil was appointed as the Mission Superior and he was instrumental in starting the Anbu Illam, a home for the mentally challenged destitute, near Thenpothai. It was in 2007 that the MCBS Fathers procured land at Vadakarai and

Anbu Illam was shifted to Vadakarai. In 2004, MCBS Fathers started St Joseph Matriculation School in Meenakshipuram. In 2013, the Congregation began St Joseph CBSE School in Thenpothai. In the year 2017, the Fathers began a tailoring unit called NILA for the empowerment of women. In 2018 a new school was opened at Surandai. The MCBS Fathers time and again at the request of the Diocese served at St George Parish, Mekkarai. The missionary activities of the MCBS Fathers have been very instrumental in our presence in Sengottai and nearby areas.

The Silver Jubilee celebration was organized on VITH GOD, ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE 18 January 2022 at St Joseph Higher Secondary School. The celebration began with the Eucharistic celebration presided over by His Excellency Mar George Rajendran sdb. Rev. Fr Dominic Mundath MCBS, Provincial Superior was present for the celebrations. The newly renovated chapel was blessed. A brief public gathering was held in which all the speakers recalled the blessings of God with gratitude. Gifts and mementos were presented. We thank and congratulate the MCBS Fathers.





### **SEMINAR AT THENKASI MISSION**

The Silver Jubilee celebrations of the Thenkasi Mission have received a fillip with the one-day seminar on Consolidation of Catholic Faith organized for the Catechism teachers, youth, members of Mission League, and Kuzhanthai Eeso lyakkam on 26 January 2022 at Pastoral Centre, Boarder, Vanchinagar. The Sinai Retreat Centre Kalluvilai took the initiative to organize a day of retreat for the youth and the catechism teachers; the Mission League students were animated by the Diocesan Team for Vocation Promotion; the little children had their animation program organized by the Kuzhanthai Eeso Iyakkam. A team of Fathers and Sisters of the Diocese from Kanniyakumari took the different sessions for the day's seminar for the various groups. The team witnessed the active participation of the Catholics of the Thenkasi Mission and we can observe a bright future for the Church in the area.





### **BLESSING OF ST ALPHONSA CONVENT**

The FCC Sisters of Idukki Province started a community at Chinnamanur in Theni Mission on 12 August 2019 to begin missionary work. In the presence of Mar Jose Pulickal, Bishop of Kanjirapally, His Excellency Mar George Rajendran sdb had blessed the rented house. Later the Sisters had purchased a plot of land nearby and built a Convent which was blessed on 22 January 2022. Rev. Sr Suhuna FCC, Provincial

Superior of Idukki, cut the ribbon and inaugurated the Convent. Mar George Rajendran sdb blessed the chapel and the house during the concelebrated Holy Mass which was solemnized by the presence of Mar Jose Pulickal, Bishop of Kanjirapally. The Diocese is very glad that the Sisters have found for themselves a comfortable home in order to support their *Ad Gentes* Mission and Evangelisation.





# TRAINING ON PSYCHO-SOCIAL PRACTICE FOR ANIMATORS AND VOLUNTEERS

The current COVID 19 outbreak createda deep impact not only in the health scenario and the economic situation but also on the psychosocial well-being of societies across nations, particularly among children. Given this, a training program was conducted by Rev. Fr Thomas Sebastian, Director of KKSSS on Psycho-social care during the third wave outbreak. He emphasized the importance of psycho-social support during the school

closure period and reiterated the significance of COVID-appropriate behaviors during the current health crisis. 50 participants participated and benefited from the program. It was wonderful to see the participants interacting and raising many issues affecting young children in the society. They expressed their worry about the future and the threats the children continue to face.







We are very grateful to the Diocese of Kanjirapally for coming forward to partner with our Diocese to develop the mission district of Theni. The Diocese had appointed Rev. Fr Benny Thattamparambil as the mission incharge. The Diocese had bought a plot of land near the FCC Convent at Chinnamanur. Bishop Mar Jose

Pulickal blessed and laid the foundation stone for the presbytery on 22 January 2022 before the blessing of the FCC Convent. Until now the priest was coming from Kumily for the Holy Mass. This new house will be an added advantage for continuing the *Ad Gentes* Mission in Chinnamannurarea.





### **PONGAL CELEBRATIONS**

The harvesting festival of Tamils, considered a thanksgiving festival for the abundance of the harvest, was celebrated as Educare Pongal to inculcate the traditional values and celebrations of ancient Tamils among school children. The festive celebration was facilitated by Rev. FrThomas Sebastian, director of KKSSS. The Chief Guest, Rev. Sr Reeja, CMC elucidated the cultural heritage of Tamils and the importance of preserving agriculture. The young children were very enthusiastic about learning the ancient culture and the present significance of the celebration.

# CELEBRATION OF DON BOSCO FEAST





# Rev. Sr Maria FCC A True Call for Ardent Service

The fragrance of Thuckalay Mission ever includes the tireless service rendered by Sr. Maria FCC, fondly called Mariamma. She was born on 24 April 1936, in the Ikaraparmapil family Changanacherry. When she was two years old, her mother was called for eternal rest. Later child Maria was under the care of her aunt. The disciplined Christian exemplary life of her aunt helped to cultivatethe seeds of piety, which helped her in recognizing her vocation to religious life. True to her name, she developed a special devotion to Mother Mary. Maria realized the power of the recital of the Rosary from childhood. Being a brilliant student, her friends loved her very much and admired her memory power and quick learning skills. She completed her Secondary studies at St. Joseph's school Changanacherry and joined for her bachelor's education from St. Berchman's College Changanacherry. After completing her B.Sc. studies with flying colors, she joined NSS College for B.Ed. Course. Besides her routine studies, she worked hard to become a good and model teacher in the future.

She joined St. Peters High School, Kurumpanadam to start her career as a teacher. Teaching for her was not a profession but a vocation. She moved on to teach in St. Joseph's Training School, Vazhappally, St. Berchman's School, and St. Anne's School Chanagancherry forming thousands of good students





to be good humans and to achieve in their academics. The students loved her as they found in Ms. Maria a loving and caring mother. She had started even free tuition services for children from poor families. Her school service was a great inspiration for her colleagues. Mar Thomas Tharayil, Auxiliary Bishop of Chanagancherry is one among her alumni in the school.

The period of teaching in various schools was also a time for Ms. Maria to reflect on her life in the future. She always kept a special relationship and friendship with sisters of the Clarist Congregation. Their simple and poor way of life inspired Maria to take a final decision to dedicate her life to lesus. The family also supported her in this firm decision to leave everything behind to join the Franciscan Clarist Convent. She was not alone, rather together with her, there were other two teachers and a student who joined the Convent. Even though the students felt very sad about Maria Teacher leaving, they were eagerly waiting to see her in the religious habit. During the formation period, she was a serious student, concentrating very much on prayer and profound spiritual guidance. She was interested in reading the constitution of the congregation and books of saints. She had always kept with her books of St. Francis and St. Clare. After the primary formation period, she took her first vows on 2 May 1970 and after four years she professed her final commitment to the Lord on 2 May 1974. Rev. Sr



Maurus FCC, the first Superior General of the united FCC Congregation is her aunt.

Besides teaching, she was very kind to everyone in the convents where she worked. Her dedication to every service entrusted to herwas an underlying factor of the life of our dear Mariamma. Although she served the congregation in different positions, she had always carried a humble and service-minded personality. Until 1998, she served the Changanacherry Province as a hostel warden, novice mistress, provincial councilor, Provincial Superior, and so on. As a novice mistress, she had special care for the novices participating in their joys and sorrows. Even the families of the novices had kept a good relationship with Mariamma and they still remember her fondly with gratitude for her timely interventions and prayers during their trial periods.

The missionary zeal of Mariamma brought her to the newly formed mission Diocese of Thuckalay in 1998. She came forward for the progress of economically and socially backward people, who were living in very pathetic situations. She fought against the social injustice of caste discrimination. Mariamma did not hesitate to stretch her hands for asking aid from people for these poor. Chenamkode, Bengiri and Mezhakode are some of the houses started by Mariamma.

The life of Mariamma was an exemplary one for her fellow sisters. Her smiling face and sweet-talking had melted many times, serious issues and rivalries. She enhanced the documentation process in many parishes and convents in both Chanagancherry and Thuckalay provinces. Her loyalty to her religious superiors was another important specialty of her personality. She had kept a motherly concern and love

for priests and bishops. Many priests and bishops remember her with gratitude for this spiritual maternal care. Her hospitality towards people inspired many to keep a good relationship with her and those convents she served in. She had a particular concern for the poor and never missed offering food for the needy. The teaching experience and the capacity of communication helped her to be a good catechist and to give formation to children and other catechism teachers. She was also regular in visiting families and counseling services. As a result of these visits, she could have saved many families, who were at the edge of division.

"The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." The final words of our Jesus Christ to his disciples expose the life of many religions. Though Mariamma had some health issues from her childhood, she believed that the Lord was taking her through little sufferings to make her stronger for His Kingdom. "The Spirit of the Lord is on me because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Lc.4, 18). She became seriously ill in 2015 after being diagnosed with cancer on her right leg. Due to a stroke in 2016, she was physically paralyzed. But she was strong in spirit and continued her service for others through her fervent prayers.

The Lord received her to her heavenly bliss on 29 September 2019. The final hours of her earthly life were accompanied by the prayers of many priests, sisters, and laypeople. The funeral took place on the feast of St. Little Flower, on 1October 2019 at Azhakiyamandapam Provincial House. Mariamma continues to inspire every missionary.





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
