Dear and Rev. Fathers.

Greetings and prayerful wishes Bishop's House, Thuckalay!

We are entering the month of December. It is a month of festivities in the Church - the season of Annunciation, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of our Blessed Mother, and finally, the solemnity of the birth of Jesus Christ. We began the season of Annunciation on 27 November 2022, the four weeks, in preparation to the feast of the Nativity of Jesus, celebrated on 25th December constitute this season. In this season we practice abstinence from 1st to 25th December in preparation for Christmas, we call this period "25 days Lent". Let us make known this practice to all our faithful and exalt them to observe the days of 25 days lent.

This season of annunciation is called 'subbara' in Syriac language. The meaning of this term is 'declaration, 'announcement' etc. What angel Gabriel announced to holy Mary was the greatest glad news to humanity that eagerly waited for the Saviour. Thus, this season is developed in the context of the mystery of incarnation completed in the fullness of time. The Church recalls during these days the announcement of the birth of John the Baptist, the predecessor of Jesus, and also the joyful event of the birth of John the Baptist. As a preparation for the celebration of the mystery of incarnation, this season also recalls creation, disobedience of our first parents and its consequences, the miserable state of the broken humanity, the promise of salvation offered by God, God's covenant with humanity, and the prophecies about the Saviour. During this season we also meditate on the role of Mary in the history of the plan of salvation.

Christmas is about a definitive moment in time, in human history, when God showed that He cared for every one of us by entering into our humanity so that He could walk with us, live with us, lead us, carry us and lift us to that better place. It is, therefore, not just about celebrations, but rather about the love of our God who wanted to become one with us so deeply, that he gave up his divinity to enter into our wretched humanity.

"Maranatha" (Rev. 22: 20) is an Aramaic (Syriac) expression that means: "Come, Lord Jesus." It was used as a greeting in the early church. When believers gathered or parted, they did not say hello or goodbye, but "Maranatha!" If we had the same spiritual outlook today, it would revolutionize the church and the lives of its members during this season. This should be our prayer and greeting during this season – come, Lord Jesus.

Christmas - the birth of God in a poor manger - is the most celebrated feast in this world. Christmas offers us all an opportunity to recapture glimpses of childhood's sacred memories. There is timelessness about gazing into the crib and coming face to face with the truth that God came down from heaven and dwelt

among us as a helpless baby. The gospel story tells us that at Bethlehem on a starry night the Son of God was born. A burst of light startled the shepherds, and angels sang at his birth. It is the simplicity of this happening that captures the imagination. Christmas is more than a story that is told – it is about a birth that brings heaven right down to earth. Love came down at Christmas, broke the sacred barrier between creature and Creator and gave an eternal value to our lives. God has given us the gift of reaching beyond ourselves and discovering the joy of heaven.

There was nothing romantic about the first Christmas. Christ's birth was a hard and bitter experience for Joseph and Mary, two poor people with doors slammed in their faces. They were the picture of poverty with neither room nor lodgings; forced to shelter in a stable outside the entry walls, where animals gave up their manger for the child Jesus. The Christ who was to die on Calvary outside of Jerusalem was born outside of Bethlehem. The message is clear from the very beginning that the love of God is available to all, but especially the poor, the weak, the disadvantaged. The stable is an indication of our need to see grace and goodness in the most deprived of people. As we kneel before the crib, we can pray for the vision during this short life of ours to see things God's way and for the courage to act according to his will.

Christmas becomes meaningful when we welcome the Lord as he comes to us in the wonder of every human being and as he reveals himself in the value and dignity of every person with whom we live and work. One of the things that makes Christmas very special is being remembered by friends. It is essentially a family feast and an occasion for exchanging gifts and sharing the warmth of our homes in the company of friends. Our hearts and our thoughts are especially with family members who are absent and unable to take part in our festivities. God's presence and love can be experienced in healing misunderstandings, patching up quarrels and letting bygones be bygones. Sometimes removing bitterness can be extremely difficult, but forgiving and forgetting will enable us to enjoy our Christmas happiness to the full.

Christmas is also about kindness, about giving and about the returning of love for love. It's the time of year when our hearts are in the right place and when we realize it is more blessed to give than to receive. We become alive and sensitive to the many needs of the poor who are crying out for our generosity and caring. Spare a thought also for those people who find the going tough and whose lives at this particular time are in the shadow of the crib because of a cross or a recent death. Our joy highlights their sadness. May your Christmas be a holy one because if it is, it will be a happy and joyful one!

On 8 December, we celebrate the solemnity of Immaculate Conception. Mary is the world's most remarkable model of an Advent figure. At a given moment in salvation history, God asked her to mother his Son. It was a demanding invitation and one which troubled her greatly. When she gave her reply to the angel Gabriel, let it be done to me according to your word, the salvation process began and from her humanity came his flesh and blood. To be worthy of such an honour, God graced her with freedom from original sin from the first moment of her conception. Mary had to be immaculate, untouched by sin from the first moment of her birth. The mother, who was carrying God's son, not for herself but for a world in need, could have no hand, act or part in sin. Mary became Christ's first disciple and the very model of what discipleship means.

The solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a doctrinal feast, which celebrates Mary's first moment of existence, in the womb of her mother, St Anne. This feast also celebrates the humility and faith of Mary, a woman who accepted the challenge which God put before her. She is an example of what human life is capable of achieving when touched by the grace of God. Like many a mother she gave a child to the world while remaining unaware of the details of God's plan. We should not think that because Mary was

free from sin her life was without struggles. She was subject to the same doubts and anguishes that we all face. Like her son, she shared all our problems and difficulties showing us the value of patience amidst our own trials, by turning sorrow and trouble into hope and joy.

Mary reminds us of the goodness of God which is the source and root of our life. What he wills for Mary he wills for all of us. In sending his Son into our world, God wanted to share the very best of Himself with us, by making us his adopted sons and daughters. God calls each of us like Mary to welcome Jesus and to make room for him in our lives. If we give him cooperation in living his word and sharing his cross, he will shape us into a worthy dwelling place for his Son. Mary teaches us what it means to abandon ourselves completely to God's will and to be fully at his disposal. We are fortunate to call Mary our mother and to claim her as the model to imitate to the best of our ability. Of all creatures, she is the closest in love to God, nearest to his heart and everything a human being should be. Her Immaculate Conception calls us to be more freely and totally ourselves according to God's eternal plan.

Let us as we enter into this wonderful month of December, let us together with Mary prepare ourselves to welcome the child Jesus. He comes knocking. He stoops low and invites us to find him in the lowly places of this world, in the lowly places of our own life. What are the things in your life that may be crowding out Jesus? What obstacles and preoccupations leave little or no room for him? What keeps you from recognizing Jesus and opening the door wide when he comes? If you have already opened the door to him for many years, praise God and ask the Lord to help you open wider. Even though many of us have invited Jesus in, we have given him poor accommodations, perhaps relegating him to the couch or the floor.

Hence, the message of Christmas, dear Fathers, is this: make room for Jesus. Make more and more room for him in the inn of your soul. The Scripture assures us: "Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the power to become children of God" (Jn 1:12). Christmas night is a night of gifts and Jesus stoops low to give us a priceless gift: the power to become children of God. However, the question is: Is there room in the 'inn' of our hearts?

NEWS AND EVENTS

Pastoral Council at Sangamam: The fourth Meeting of the VI Pastoral Council was held at Sangamam on 01 November 2022 at 10. 00 am. In my absence, with my special mandate Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, the Vicar General presided over the meeting. In the TNBC Meeting held in the month of July, it was decided to organize awareness programmes in the diocesan level about different welfare schemes of the government for the good of the people. Therefore, an awareness class was organized in the pastoral council on the rights and duties of unorganized workers. Adv. Thenpandian and Rev. Fr. John Paul sdb were the resource persons of the day. In the second session, a fruitful discussion took place on the possibilities of beginning a welfare committee in our diocese under the guidance of laity commission to provide a helping hand to the workers who belong to the unorganized sector. Around 63 members participated in the Pasatoral Council and it was ended at 01.30 pm. I thank Rev. Fr. Thomas Sathianesan, the Director and Mr. John Kumarithozhan, the Secretary for organizing it well.

SMYM: Training of Animators and Resource persons: Under the leadership of SMYM, a one day special training for the selected members was held at Kalluvilai on 01 November 2022. The morning session of the programme was animated by Ms. Sherin (Velicham Foundation). The trainer helped the trainees to have a method on analysing the problems faced by the youth in the society and gave the tools to provide solutions. The afternoon session was animated by Fr. Arul Antony sdb, the director of

Vazhikatti together with Fr. John Paul sdb. It was a practical session wherein the youth were asked to take classes on various themes. Twenty youth took part in the training and 6 youth are part of a youth resource team. On the same day from 1.30 pm to 4.00 pm, Ms. Sherin gave training to 30 religious and lay animators. She focused on the problems in the society, our attitudinal change and response. Care for the youth was the central theme for training. I appreciate Fr. Joseph Santhosh for the successful coordination of the programme.

Painting competition at KKSSS, Kalluvilai: To expose the talents and creativity by painting on plain canvas, a painting competition was organized by KKSSS at Kalluvilai on 01 November 2022. The competition has conducted as part of the Golden Jubilee celebration of KKSSS. 35 students from various schools of the district participated in it. The cash prize was announced for the winners. Congratulation to the winners and coordinators!

Dance Fest at Kalluvilai: Under the directions of Family Apostolate, a dance competition was held at Aseer Auditorium, Kalluvilai on 05 November 2022 for the members of Mathru Jyothis. Fr. Abin Poovathumoottil inaugurated the competition by lighting the lamp. 12 teams from different parishes participated in it. Following teams were awarded prizes: first prize went to Soosaipuram Parish, second prize went to Marappady and third prize to Thakkalivilai and Thuckalay Parishes. I thank Fr. KII Animators' Online Meet: An online meeting of the animators of Kuzhanthai Isso Iyakkam was held on 05 November 2022 at 02.00 pm. In the meeting presided over by the Director Fr. Anil Raj, future plans, such as convention, competitions and Christmas celebration were discussed. Animators wished Sr. Lisa SH who celebrated the Silver Jubilee of her first profession. The director thanked for the support given by the animators for the animation programme conducted in the month of September 2022.

Writing Competition at Padanthalumoodu: Eparchial level Bible Fest Writing competition was held on 06 November 2022 at Padanthalumoodu Forane Church campus at 02.30 pm. The first and second place winners of the Forane level writing competitions were the participants of the competition. 168 students participated in the competition. 26th Diocesan Day Celebrations: In remembrance of the Diocesan Foundation Day on 11 November, the Eparchy celebrated on 13 November 2022, the 26th Diocesan Day at Sacred Heart Forane Church, Padanthalumoodu. The celebrations started at 3.00 pm with a concelebrated Holy Qurbana. I presided over it. Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, the Vicar General welcomed all the faithful. An offertory procession was done before the Holy Qurbana by the Kaikars of each parish and the Local Superior of the convents. The Holy Qurbana was followed by an open stage cultural programme presented by the various departments and parishes. Rev. Fr. Joshy Kulathumkal, Chancellor, presented a brief audio visual report of the Eparchy. The first batch of the Sinai Theological Institute, who have successfully completed their degree course in theology were honoured with degree certificate. Then they bought a new plot at Peunchilambu and constructed the house. Blessing of the newly built Providence Home was done on 20 December 1999. The Jubilee Year was inaugurated on 3 December 2021. The concluding celebration of Silver Jubilee was held on 16 November 2022 at 10.00 am at Providence Home, Perunchilambu. In the thanksgiving Holy Qurbana celebrated by me, Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, Fr. Thomas Thumbayil, Fr. Thomas Thekkethala and Fr. Mathew Thekkekettu were the concelebrants. The Holy Qurbana was followed by a public meeting presided over by me. Along with Rev. Sr. Rosily LSDP, the Superior General of LSDP congregation a good number Sisters came from Generalate House and many Fathers, Sisters and the public were also present from our Eparchy for the event. Vestition & First Profession at Karode: Four novices of FCC San Joe Province Thuckalay made their First Religious Profession and Vestition on 19 November 2022, 10 am at St. Joseph's Church, Karode. The ceremony began with Solemn Holy Qurbana presided by me. Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, Fr. James Pannamkuzhy, Fr. Peter Kizhakkeyil, Fr. Joseph Santhosh, Fr. Vinod Kanakkalil and Fr. John Joseph were the concelebrants. We congratulate the newly professed Sisters – Sr. Majitha M.P., Sr. Abisha R, Sr. Merin Suju M.R. and Sr. Benishma Theres S.B – and wish them God's blessings in their religious life. I thank Rev. Fr.
