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
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Dear Friends and Benefactors.

On 3 July, we celebrated Dukhrana, the feast of St Thomas. The doubt of St Thomas after the resurrection of Jesus became a moment of solid belief: "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28). His encounter with Jesus teaches us how the right response to doubt, curiosity and searching can lead to deep belief. For us, Syro-Malabar Christians, Dukhrana represents not merely a liturgical celebration but a reaffirmation of our apostolic origins and unique identity within the global Christian community. The feast serves as a powerful reminder of our unbroken connection to the apostolic age, distinguishing us from later missionary activities and reinforcing our claim to an indigenous Christian tradition that predates European colonisation by over a millennium. The liturgies, processions, and cultural celebrations that we re-enact that day blend ancient Syriac traditions with local customs, creating a distinctive expression of faith that honours both our apostolic roots and our Indian cultural heritage.

Pope Francis reminds us: "God does not fear our questions, but invites us to touch His wounds, to discover that faith is not a theory but an encounter with Him, alive and risen." St. Thomas is the living proof of this truth. His honest questions led him to the most important confession of faith in Scripture: "My Lord and my God" (John 20:28).

St. Thomas teaches us that:

- Faith does not exclude questions; it welcomes the search for truth.
- Real faith emerges when we are willing to approach Jesus personally, even with our wounds and doubts.

History tells us that this same Thomas, once hesitant, became a missionary full of zeal. His feet carried the Gospel to India, where he sowed the seeds of Christian faith in our land. Despite challenges, he persevered, even to the point of martyrdom. As Pope Francis said, "A faith that does not journey, that remains still and closed in itself, is not the faith of Jesus." St. Thomas lived a faith on mission.

In the Diocese of Thuckalay, we proudly trace our spiritual roots to this Apostle. His story continues to inspire and challenge us:

- Are we prepared to proclaim Christ boldly, like St. Thomas?
- Is our faith something personal and alive, or merely inherited tradition?

May his example encourage us to:

- Seek Jesus sincerely whenever doubts arise.
- Deepen our relationship with Him through personal encounter and prayer.
- Witness courageously to the Gospel in our families, parishes, and communities.

As we look upon the image of St. Thomas — traditionally shown placing his hand on the Lord's wounds — let it remind us that faith grows where we meet Christ personally.

On this sacred feast, may St. Thomas the Apostle intercede for each of us, that we might, like him, move from uncertainty to a living proclamation: "My Lord and my God."

At the Crossroads of Communion:

Inter-Eparchial Meet Held in Kanyakumari

On 30 June 2025, the Diocese of Thuckalay had the honour of hosting the Inter-Eparchial Meeting at the Stella Maris Auditorium, located within the campus of the DM Sisters, Kanyakumari, near the sacred convergence of land and sea, Thriveni Sangamam. This historic gathering brought together bishops and priests from the Eparchies of Palai, Kanjirappally, Changanacherry, and Thuckalay, fostering fraternity, collaboration, and shared vision among the Syro-Malabar dioceses. The meeting was held under the presidency of His Grace Mar Thomas Tharayil, Metropolitan Archbishop of Changanacherry, marking his first official visit to the Diocese of Thuckalay since his appointment. The Bishop

of Thuckalay warmly welcomed all participating bishops and clergy, with a special gesture of heartfelt welcome to the Archbishop, whose presence greatly honoured the occasion. A total of 80 participants, including 22 priests from the host diocese, attended the meeting. The gathering also included department directors, institutional heads, and mission representatives from the participating eparchies, representing a wide cross-section of ecclesial leadership and pastoral outreach. This Inter-Eparchial Meet stood as a milestone of ecclesial communion and strategic collaboration, setting a firm foundation for future partnerships and joint initiatives.







Stewards of the Church:

Kaikkars and Accountants Gather for Formation at Kalluvilai



The Diocese of Thuckalay hosted its annual Meeting and Orientation Programme for Kaikkars and Parish Accountants on Sunday, 29 June 2025, at Kalluvilai, drawing approximately 60 dedicated lay participants from across the diocese. The event was designed to equip lay leaders with the pastoral, administrative, and spiritual tools necessary for effective service within their parish communities. The day began with a solemn celebration of the Holy Qurbana at 10:00 a.m., presided over by the Bishop, setting the tone for a day rooted in faith and commitment. During the session, the second edition of Palliyogam – Procedure Rules was also officially released, providing updated guidelines for effective parish administration. The second session featured Rev. Fr. Dominic Dhas, Cooperative Manager of the Diocese of Kuzhithurai, who offered a scripture-based reflection on Christian leadership. Drawing from real pastoral experiences, he addressed both the strengths and challenges of lay leadership within today's Church. In the afternoon sessions, Rev. Fr. Joshy Kulathumkal and Rev. Fr. Subin Puthenpurackal led two indepth resource talks, offering participants practical and canonical insights. Topics included the roles and responsibilities of Kaikkars, the functioning of Pothumantram and Panku Peravai, and the parish accounting system. Their sessions provided both clarity and empowerment to those responsible for the financial and pastoral coordination at the grassroots level.







The renovated chapel at the Sacred Heart (SH) Convent in Malaicode was blessed on 5 June 2025 at 6:30 p.m., in a solemn ceremony presided over by the Bishop. Members of the diocesan curia and priests associated with the SH Convent parish also graced the occasion with their presence. Following the blessing, an agape meal brought the community together in joyful fellowship. During the gathering, Sr. Anitha SH, the Mission Superior, conveyed her heartfelt gratitude to all who contributed to and supported the renovation. The Bishop too extended his sincere appreciation to the Reverend Sisters, acknowledging their initiative and dedicated efforts in transforming the chapel into a more beautiful and spiritually uplifting space.

Christ Jubilee Celebrated with Missionaries in Madurai



The Christ Jubilee celebration of the missionaries from the diocese was held on 12 June 2025 at St. Mary's Church, Ariyur - Madurai, in a spirit of thanksgiving and renewal.
