Message

Dear Friends and Benefactors,

Warm greetings in the spirit of the upcoming Christmas season from Bishop's House, Thuckalay! As we joyfully anticipate the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, I extend our heartfelt wishes to you.

Christmas is about a definitive moment in time, in human history, when God showed that He cared for every one of us by entering into our humanity so that He could walk with us, so that He could live with us so that He could lead us, carry us, and lift us to that better place. It is therefore not just about holidays but rather about the love of our God, who wanted to become one with us so deeply that he gave up his divinity to enter into our wretched humanity.

Christmas - the birth of God in a poor manger - is the most celebrated feast in this world. Christmas offers us all an opportunity to recapture glimpses of childhood's sacred memories. There is something unique about gazing into the crib and coming face-to-face with the truth that God came down from heaven and dwelt among us as a helpless baby. The gospel story tells us that at Bethlehem on a starry night, the Son of God was born. A burst of light startled the shepherds, and angels sang at his birth. In the simplicity of the stable, amid the lowly animals and the humble shepherds, God reveals His grand plan for salvation. The birth of Jesus is a testament to the God who enters into our human experience and who chooses to dwell among us amid our joys and struggles. It is a divine proclamation that no one is beyond the reach of God's love, no matter how insignificant or broken we may feel.

There was nothing idealistic about the first Christmas. Christ's birth was a hard and bitter experience for Joseph and Mary, two poor people with doors slammed in their faces. They were the picture of poverty, with neither room nor lodging, forced to shelter in a stable outside the entry walls, where animals gave up their manger for the child Jesus. The Christ who was to die on Calvary outside of Jerusalem was born outside of Bethlehem. The message is clear from the very beginning: the love of God is available to all, but especially the poor, the weak, and the disadvantaged. The stable is an indication of our need to see grace and goodness in the most deprived of people. As we kneel before the crib, we can pray for the vision during this short life of ours to see things God's way and for the courage to act according to his will.

Christmas becomes meaningful only when we welcome the Lord, who comes to us in the wonder of every human being and

as he reveals himself in the value and dignity of every person with whom we live and work. One of the things that makes Christmas very special is being remembered by friends. It is essentially a family feast and an occasion for exchanging gifts and sharing the warmth of our homes in the company of friends. Our hearts and our thoughts are especially with family members who are absent and unable to take part in our festivities. God's presence and love can be experienced in healing misunderstandings, patching up quarrels, and letting bygones be bygones. Sometimes removing bitterness can be extremely difficult, but forgiving and forgetting will enable us to enjoy our Christmas happiness to the fullest.

Christmas is also about giving, and about the return of love for love. It is the time of year when our hearts are in the right place and when we realise it is more blessed to give than to receive. We become alive and sensitive to the many needs of the poor, who are crying out for our generosity and caring. Spare a thought also for those people who find the going tough and whose lives at this particular time are in the shadow of the crib because of a cross or a recent death. Our joy highlights their sadness.

During this season, let us unwrap the gift of love bestowed upon us by God. Let us embrace the message of the Christ-child - a message of peace, goodwill, and reconciliation. In a world hungry for meaning and purpose, the birth of Jesus reminds us that true fulfilment comes from aligning our lives with the will of God

I wish you and your family dear friends, a Merry Christmas and a God-filled New Year 2024. May you have a faith experience of the Babe of Bethlehem as you prepare to celebrate Christmas! May our Blessed Mother intercede for each one of us!

The Sisters of the Divine Saviour (SDS) joyously commemorated their Golden Jubilee in India on November 4, 2023, at Little Flower Forane Church, Manjalumoodu. Exactly fifty years prior, on December 5, 1973, twelve Sisters embarked on a mission to establish the congregation's charism on Indian soil, specifically in Manjalumoodu. Over the years, they endeared themselves to the local population in the district of Kanyakumari through dedicated humanitarian service, considering it the most profound form of service. Their impactful initiatives included promoting gospel values through catechism, aiding home deliveries, conducting mother and child welfare programmes, tending to leprosy patients, providing healthcare services through hospitals, and offering primary education through nursery schools.

The Jubilee celebration commenced at 9:30 am with a solemn thanksgiving Holy Qurbana officiated by Rev. Bishop. Most Rev. Anthonysamy Savarimuthu, the Bishop of Palayamkottai, delivered the homily, and numerous Fathers from the diocese of Thuckalay and neighbouring dioceses concelebrated. Following the Holy Qurbana, a public meeting unfolded at 12:00 noon. The pioneer missionary sisters received well-deserved honors from the Provincial Superior, Sr. Anish SDS, with the Assistant General Superior also gracing the event.



"By the Grace of God, I am what I am" Sr. Linse Vallomthara SABS

Religious vocation is a precious gift from God. There is always a close connection between calling and beauty — a spiritual, human and etymological connection. The call, therefore, appears as beauty. In fact, we are called, we are chosen from eternity; we just have to discover the calling destined for us. The diocese of Thuckalay has got the privilege to testimony such beauty of many religious vocations, expressed through their missionary zeal and service for the people. In this current issue, Tidings team proudly introduces the missionary life of a religious sister, belonging to the congregation of Sisters of the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Sr.Linse VallomtharaSABS.

Tidings: Thank you very much dear Sister, for your kind acceptance of our request for this interaction to be published in this issue of Tidings online Monthly. We are sure about the fact that your testimony of religious life will inspire our readers. We are so grateful to you dear sister for the kind acceptance of our invitation to share your life story with our readers. Let us begin with your family?

Sr. Linse: As for every religious, the root of my vocation is none other than my family. Being a member of a traditional catholic family, I was always instructed by my parents to lead a pious life, from the very beginning of childhood. We were 9 children and my father was a farmer. Being the last child, it was my privilege to be an apple in everyone's eye. Daily prayer in family and the daily holy Qurbana were the two pillars of our family. I



was born and brought up in a prayerful atmosphere in the family. My house was situated in a parish called Padaharam. During my childhood, it was only a station church and Holy Qurbana was celebrated only on Sundays. But my parents were strict about the participation of daily holy Qurbana and we were walking at least half an hour to reach in the Church. Besides, family catechesis was also helpful to shape my moral life.

Another important pious practice of my father was the daily reading of Bible, with loud voice at early morning. For us it was like an alarm to get up and ready for Holy Qurbana. We, sisters and brothers were with one heart, to play together, to pray together, to eat together etc. We used to play dramas at home, taking different ecclesiastical characters. We have grown seeing our parents, taking care of our grandparents with much love, passion and







patience. It helped us a lot to mold our lives with such a caring heart. As we were near to St.Mary's Forane Church kalloorkad, Champakulam, it was a tradition to participate in 13, 24 hours adoration. In such a way the Holy Qurbana became a part of my life.

Tidings: It is blessed family and thanks to God. Can you share about your schooling and various influences for your religious vocation??

Sr. Linse: I finished my SSLC from St.Mary's High School Champakulam and continued my pre-degrees studies in St. Aloysius college Edathua. In 1994, after my pre-degree studies I joined in convent of adoration sisters. From my early childhood, it was my dream to render my life for Jesus and for His services.

Besides, the life of my elder sister, who was already in a convent influenced me a lot and infused in me a spirit of religious thirst. Another life example was that of St. Alphonsa. Her simplicity and selfless life were a challenging factor for me to follow her path. I wanted to join in the Franciscan Clarist congregation, but the will of God was different. I went to Changanacherry for a vocation camp, and during which I recognized the call of God in my heart addressing me to the Adoration sisters. The devotion which we kept from our childhood onwards to the Holy Eucharist and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, helped me a lot to ease my choice to become a nun. It was during my pre degree studies I heard the voice of the Lord asking me, "I need you". It is my strength even today especially amidst of trials and troubles.



Tidings: Great! How was the formation period? hobbies?

Sr. Linse: The first days away from the family was so painful. Those days, I had spent many hours before the holy Eucharist and our Mother Mary, with tears. Later I could have found in mother Mary, my own mother and I started loving her more. It gave me strength to go ahead peacefully with other sisters. I took more time for personal prayers and persona adoration. During my novitiate, I had knelt down before God for many hours. I know that I could not have anything by my own, but the strength of the prayer life of my father and my mother. Reciting the ejaculatory prayers was another powerhouse of my religious life.

My hobbies are very simple. I enjoy reading books especially the life stories of saints. St. Theresa of Lisieux, St. Philomena, St. John of the Cross, St. Alphonsa, St. Charles de Foucault etc. were some of them. **Tidings:** You are working with the differently abled children? What is your inspiration to this field?

Sr. Linse: The inspiration to serve the differently abled children began so early during my school days. There was a differently abled child on my way to school and every day I stopped for a while with him to talk. Then it became my dream to offer my life for these children and to share my joy with them. Later as a sister, as I completed my degree in commerce, my superiors decided me to apply for the accountant post in the college, though my wish was to spend my life with the differently abled children. My application was rejected and my superiors reconsidered my request to work among the children.

Tidings: How did you come to Tamilnadu Mission? Your experiences?

Sr. Linse: In my batch there were a few sisters from Tamilnadu. I used to listen to them and

slowly I started loving the language, culture and people. In 1998, I came to Palappallam convent, near to Colachel. I liked the simplicity and hard - working attitude of the people. We started a small school for the differently abled children. It was built with coconut leaves. But it is not the building but the communion between the members makes a house a home. Our small school was a home for everyone. One day I scolded one child for an error that he had committed. But, at late night he came with his parents to ask pardon to me. It helped me to realize the innocence of my children. My life with them gave me a heavenly experience and they were angels.

As these children were belonging to poor families, I was forced many times to stretch my hands before them begging economical support. I had never felt shy to ask help for them. We feel so proud of them, when they reach up to a level of auto sufficiency. During their journey God helped us a lot to achieve many goals in their life. Recently we could have presented two of our children for the World Special Olympics game, held in Germany and they achieved the first positions. It was not easy, each step which we had taken to participate them in the games. Diplomatically we struggled a lot. But I always believed in the words, "nothing is impossible to God".

Tidings: Are you satisfied in your missionary services and what do you want to share with the readers of Thuckalay Tidings?

Sr. Linse: This year I complete my 25th year in the Thuckalay mission. I enjoy each day here in the mission, making house visits, charity works, prayer services etc. Visiting the houses of people helped me a lot to understand the real situation of the life of each one, which is different from the other. I felt always that we are mere instruments in the hands of God.

Now, as an animator of mission league, youth etc.in the parish and principal of the special school, I feel closely the presence of God, who hears the cries of fragile human beings. Looking at my life, I don't merit anything but I received everything as a gift from God.

Being a sister changes the very context of my life. It presents me with great joy and also with great challenges and decisions that I sometimes wish were not there. But in the midst of it all, I recognize that for me, religious life is the path to becoming who I am called to be. Every vocation is born of sacrifice, is maintained by sacrifice and is measured in the apostolate by the sacrifice of those whom God calls to the priesthood or the religious life. This should not be surprising, once we realize that it was by His sacrifice that Christ redeemed the world. The servant is not greater than his Master. In fact, the more intimate is one's vocation to the service of Christ, the more demanding will be the sacrifices required.





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
