Message

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ, Greetings and best wishes from the Diocese of Thuckalay.

The month of May is a singular period for us to pay homage to our Blessed Mother Mary. She has played a unique role in salvation history. As the Mother of God, she was conceived without sin. By her own free will, she agreed to bring the "Word made flesh" (John 1:14), our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, into the world. Mary is foreshadowed as the one who would crush the head of the serpent in Genesis 3:15 through her Divine Son. Still, she in no way overshadows Him, nor would she ever wish to! Her life, as we surmise from the Gospels, was one of service and great devotion to Jesus. From the manger in Bethlehem where she gave birth to Him to Calvary in Jerusalem, where she stood by His cross in His crucifixion, she followed Him as a worthy disciple. Let us join the entire Catholic world in offering special honour to Our Blessed Mother during this month of May. Let us briefly reflect upon the role that our Blessed Mother plays in our lives.

Mary faced her life's journey with great realism, humanity, and practicality. Three words sum up Mary's attitude: listening, decision, and action. They are words that point out a way for us as we face what the Lord asks of us in life – Listening, decision-making, and action.

Listening: What gave rise to Mary's going to visit her relative Elizabeth? A word from God's Angel about Elizabeth, "In her old age, she has conceived a son" (Lk 1:36). Mary knew how to listen to God. It was not merely hearing but listening. It requires deep attention, serene acceptance, and total availability to God. It was not in the distracted way with which we sometimes face the Lord or others: we hear their words, but we do not listen. Mary was attentive to God. She listened to God.

Decision-making: Mary's life was one of contemplation and decision, not breathlessness or restlessness. As St Luke emphasises, "She kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (Lk 2:19, 51). Moreover, at the crucial moment of the Angel's Annunciation, she also asks, "How shall this be?" (Lk 1:34). Yet she does not stop at the moment of reflection either. She goes a step further: she decides. She

does not live in haste but goes with haste only when necessary. Mary does not let herself be dragged along by events; she does not avoid the effort of taking a decision. And this happens both in the fundamental decision that was to change her life: "I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done according to your word" (Lk 1:38) and in her daily decisions, which are routine but also full of meaning.

Action: Mary set out on a journey and went with haste (Lk 1:39). Despite the difficulties and the criticism she would have met with because of her decision to go, nothing could stop her. And here she leaves with haste. In praver, before God who speaks, in thinking and meditating on the facts of her life, Mary is not in a hurry, she does not let herself be swept away by the moment; she does not let herself be dragged along by events. However, when she has clearly understood what God is asking of her and what she has to do, she does not loiter, she does not delay; she goes with haste. St Ambrose commented: "There is nothing slow about the Holy Spirit." Mary's action was a consequence of her obedience to Angel's words but was combined with charity: she went to Elizabeth to make herself useful, and in going out of her home, of herself, for love, she takes with her the most precious thing she has: Jesus. She takes her son.

Before I conclude my reflection, I want to thank you,dear friends, for your constant prayers and support to the mission Diocese of Thuckalay. These days the catechism children are having Summer Bible classes and soon there will be Vocation camps. We have arranged for two days retreat for the catechism teachers. While I keep every one of your intentions in my prayers, I request you to pray for our Diocese and our mission. God bless you all.

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MAUNDY THURSDAY

On Maundy Thursday, we commemorate the sacred events of the Lord's Supper and the institution of Priesthood, which are key moments in the Christian faith. During every Holy Eucharist, we have the privilege of reenacting the profound words of Jesus, "This is my Body. This is my Blood. Do this in remembrance of Me". These words serve as a powerful reminder of the sacrifice that Jesus made for us and inspire us to follow in His footsteps. The day-long adoration on Maundy Thursday is a powerful way for the faithful to keep watch and unite with Jesus in His

agony at Gethsemane. This time of reflection and contemplation helps us to deepen our understanding of the immense love that Jesus has had for us, and to draw strength from that love as we face our challenges in life.

Highly proficient teachers who possess expertise in Tamil language, culture, and lifestyle took the classes. Thuckalay Youth Educational Services (TYES) animated the program, and every evening, a range of activities was conducted, including drama, debates, and literary competitions, to enhance language efficiency.

A half-day orientation session was organized at Kalluvilaion 22 April 2023for the youth in preparation for the upcoming Youth Retreat at St. Alphonse College of Arts and Science from 16 to 18 June 2023. As a whole, the session was a tremendous success and served as an excellent platform for the youth to gain valuable insights and knowledge in preparation for the upcoming Youth Retreat. INTERNATIONAL GGM CONGRESS 2023

Fiat Mission's 4th International GGM Mission Congress 2023, the Great Gathering of Mission, was a significant event held at the Jerusalem Retreat Centre in Thrissur from 19 - 23 April 2023. The congress aimed to provide an opportunity for Indian missionaries to convene and promote vocations to the mission. Furthermore, it facilitated a profound understanding of the mission by the Church in Kerala, through an array of mission exhibitions and programmes, instilling a passion and love for the mission. VPV TRAINING FOR THE CATECHISM TEACHERS

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Visuwasa Payirchi Vizha (VPV - Vacation Bible School) training course for catechism teachers and seminarians took place at the Aseer Auditorium in Kalluvilai on 29 April 2023. The training programme was graced by the presence of the Vicar General, Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, who officiated the inauguration ceremony with great poise and dignity. After the inaugural session, Rev. Fr. Robin Jose animated the teachers by providing tips to conduct VPV effectively. Then a team of teachers from the Kottar Diocese animated the course by giving action song practices. In the afternoon session, the catechetical department took centre stage, ably assisted by major seminarians, to introduce the VPV textbooks. We were happy that about 120 teachers took part in the programme.



MAJOR SEMINARIANS' WORK CAMP

This year's work camp for major seminarians was held at Little Flower Church, Puliyarai in Tenkasi Mission from 16 to 23 April 2023. A total of 18 brothers, including 3 deacons, arrived a day before and undertook the work of cleaning the Church Campus on the following day. During their stay, the brothers had the opportunity to visit neighbouring villages such as Manmoottikalam, Bhagavathipuram, Thatkonagar, Therkumedu, and Kamaraj Nagar. They spent a considerable amount of time visiting families of various religious backgrounds, which allowed them to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of the cultural differences among the people. Throughout the week, Reverend Fathers from the Tenkasi mission and the Aryankavuarea of Kerala celebrated Holy Eucharist for the brothers. Additionally, the brothers attended sessions led by Rev. Frs. Peter Kizhakeyil and Rajesh Vayalumkal MCBS, which provided them with valuable insights into mission work in the territory. The brothers enjoyed an outing to various places in and around Thenmalaon 22 April 2023, which provided them with a muchneeded break and a chance to experience fun and camaraderie. The work camp concluded on 23 April 2023 with a solemn Holy Eucharist with the parishioners, followed by a lunch shared with the people of the parish. Overall, the work camp proved to be a fruitful experience for the parish, the villagers, and the brothers.





FABC WORKSHOP AT KATHMANDU, NEPAL

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The Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC) is a voluntary association of Episcopal Conferences in Asia, approved by the Holy See, which aims to cultivate solidarity and coresponsibility among its members for the betterment of the Church and society in Asia. The decisions made by the Federation are not legally binding, but rather an expression of collective responsibility. The FABC held its 50th General Conference, which took place from 12 to 30 October 2022 at the Baan PhuWaan - Pastoral Training Centre of the Bangkok Archdiocese in Thailand. The Bangkok Document is the product of the FABC General Conference to be introduced to all the bishops, and subsequently to all faithful in the dioceses of South Asia. To accomplish this task, the FABC organized a workshop on Insights from the FABC Documents, with a particular focus on the FABC 50 Bangkok Document 2022. This workshop took place from 23 to 28 April 2023 in Kathmandu, Nepal, and was attended by 30 participants, including 20 bishops from India, Sri



Lanka, and Bangladesh. His Excellency Mar George Rajendran sdb attended the workshop.

The workshop proved to be an invaluable learning opportunity, where the participants were enriched through the exploration of the documents and their theology. It was truly a journey of discovery, where the treasures of Asian Church theology were unearthed.

The main organizer of the Conference was Bishop Allwyn, who was aided by Rev. Fr. Joshua and Rev. Sr. Shimi. This dedicated team displayed exceptional leadership gualities, and together they ensured that the workshop was a resounding success. The main resource person for the conference was Rev. Fr. Vimal, the FABC theologian from Sri Lanka, whose vast knowledge and experience of FABC enriched the participants on various topics. These topics included the importance of FABC teachings for pastors, the roles of faith and reason in theologizing, the context of FABC theologizing, harmony, care for the earth and its connection to caring for the poor, inter-faith marriages and their pastoral relevance for Asia, Amoris Laetitia - a call to love, and walking together with the people of Asia. Bishop Paul, the Bishop of Nepal Vicariate, and the Godavari Jesuit Community provided excellent arrangements for accommodation, food, and conveyance, which contributed to the overall success of the workshop. All the participants were enriched by this workshop and gained a deep understanding of the Church of South Asia's way of thinking.

VOCATION AND MISSION REV. SR CEELIA FCC "ECCE ANCILLA DOMINI"

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"The call to religious life is an invaluable gift that the Lord has given me. I owe my vocation in the first place to God, but also to my parents who passed on religious and human values to me from an early age."

Rev. Sr. Ceelia FCC, the provincial of San Joe Province Thuckalay, welcomed the Tidings team with these words to portray the history line of her dedicated religious life.

Tidings: We are very grateful to you, dear sister, for the kind acceptance of our invitation to share your life story with our readers. Let us begin with your family ...

Sr. Ceelia: Thank you so much for your invitation and I am very glad to share my life with the readers of ThuckalayTidings. What I am is the result of the initial formation which I received from my family. I was born on 15 March 1966 as the first child to my loving parents Mr. Thomas and Mrs. Catherine in a small village called Iravuchira, near Changanacherry. It was after eight years of their marriage that I was born and they used to say that I was a blessing for them. I have a brother and two sisters.

As every child in our time, I was very much obedient to my parents and it helped me a lot in my initial human and spiritual formation. One of the important factors of my religious orientation is the daily family prayer, where we gather together and pray under the guidance of our loving parents. Being a simple family, it was also easy to be in communion with each other. Today, though my parents are no more here on earth, I feel their presence at each moment of my life, especially experiencing their spiritual nearness to me.

Tidings: Wonderful, sister, and thanks be to God. Can you share about your schooling and various influences for your religious vocation?



Sr. Ceelia: Yes, of course. School formation was a continuation of what I received initially from my family. Teachers were my second parents in every aspect. I started my primary school education at St. Mary's School, Iravuchira. As the school was run by Franciscan Clarist sisters, we experienced a spiritual atmosphere on the whole campus. Sisters were very dear to us, helping with all our needs. It is one of the reasons for my religious vocation and the courage to respond to it.

Another important spiritual assistance during this period was the "Little Way Association". It was a great help for us children to listen to the inspiring and faithful lives of many saints and martyrs. Sisters, amidst their busy schedule of social and community life, were always careful about our integral development both spiritual and material. Besides, catechism classes, mission league, etc. infused in me a special love towards Jesus and Church.

After my primary education, I was taken to St. Thomas School for high school education. The school was run by Jacobite Fathers. Being a Christian Institution, there too I experienced a peaceful and spiritual ambiance, especially at the time of adolescence. I passed the SSLC with 80% marks and I render all glory to God for this great achievement. Later I joined Assumption College for pre-degree studies, which is equivalent to the +2 studies today. Initially, I was so stressed to learn the English language as the medium of teaching was in



English. I tried my level best to learn the language and worked hard to pass the exams. When the results came, I secured first class and was one of the toppers in the college. To be very frank, I must reveal that God's mysterious hand was always with me, helping me to overcome all the trials.

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Tidings: Congratulations Sister. Then what was your dream?

Sr. Ceelia: Till then I had never thought seriously about joining a convent and becoming a nun. Nursing was my dream after my pre-degree studies and it was not so tough to find a seat in a college as my academic performance was high. The objective was to support financially my family. Though these were my plans, God had another project for me. As the prophet Jeremiah says, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jer 29,11)

Tidings: Was it a sudden revelation? How did you find it?

Sr. Ceelia: Vocation is not a sudden action or magic. It is not even an option while other ways get closed before us, as the media propagates today. Vocation is a gift of God and at the same time, it is also a mystery as St. John Paul II asserts in his encyclical. I can confirm that it is true from my experiences of my life. Reading was my hobby from early childhood and I used to read the life histories of saints. There was a precious book gifted by the catechism teachers, the life story of St. Little Therese. I was so impressed by this book and especially by the heroic life story of the saint. It was my dream to help others though I have never thought about joining a convent.

Tidings: Great sister. Then when did you start seriously to recognize the call of God?

Sr. Ceelia: Prayer is the only tool to understand the plans of God. My desire to help others and in a particular way to dedicate my life to the poor, infused in me a thought of choosing religious life. I wished to join a cloister to serve the Lord in silence and to help others. It was an inspiration I received from St. Therese of Lisieux, who prayed



unceasingly for the sinners and their salvation. After my pre-degree studies, I started searching for a cloister and later God helped me to rethink to opt for a mission. My father was not so happy with my decision to go on a mission. There was also a big opposition from the whole family. It was the turning point or better speaking, distinguishing the will of God to opt for the FCC congregation as my religious refuge.

Tidings: How were your formation and other experiences in the convent?

Sr. Ceelia: I had many loving experiences with the FCC sisters during my primary education. I had already heard the life stories of St. Francis of Assisi and St. Clare and many services rendered by the Congregation all over the world. I joined the Congregation on 13 June 1983. I did my Aspirancy and Postulancy in Devamatha Provincial House, Changanacherry under the guidance of Rev. Sr Berta and Rev. Sr Generous. And I did my novitiate in Assisi Novitiate House, Puthupally. The classes, directions, and instructions of my novice master, Rev. Fr Joseph Kadukkunnel, and the novice mistress, Rev. Sr Sifincy, helped me much in my formation to mould myself to be lovable to Jesus. On 18 January 1986, I made my first profession and it was celebrated just before the arrival of Pope John Paul II in Kerala. I was blessed to receive the religious vestments from Mar Joseph Powathil in



SB High School Auditorium, Changanacherry. On 1 October 1991, I made my final profession. Meanwhile, I completed degree courses of M. Sc. and B.Ed. as per the direction of my superiors.

Tidings: Whom do you remember most during those years of formation?

Sr. Ceelia: There are many and I am very much grateful to all those who took part in my life. The words and life of Rev. Sr Jose Martin, who prepared me for the first Holy Communion touched me a lot. I was so inspired by the silent life and prayers of my mother and also the reading habit of my father. The love and care of the teachers during my high school studies strengthened me and today I recognize that God was working through these people even from the early days of my life to prepare myself to respond to the call of God.

Tidings: Then, what about your desire to go ona mission?

Sr. Ceelia: Mission and service were the two terms I wanted to put into practice in my life. I had been waiting for the time of God, who is the master of every religious to lead them to the right path. It was in 1998, FCC Changanacherry province decided to extend its province to the Kanniyakumari district and to form a region in Tamilnadu. When there was an option to choose the region, I said yes. It was another turning point in my life to reach the mission I wanted from my early life. I came to Kattathurai Convent on 21 May 1998; it was my first mission place.

Tidings: Where did you work these years of your mission service in this territory? Can you share some experiences?

Sr. Ceelia: In1998, I was appointed as the principal of St. Michael's Matriculation School, Kattathurai and I continued the service until I was elected as the Provincial of San Joe province in 2012. Meanwhile, I was also teaching in Sunday school. Besides Kattathurai, I rendered my services at Paraicode, Mezhacode, and Plankalai parishes. I enjoyed a lot the catechism classes and it was also an opportunity to know more about the Sacred Scriptures and the teachings of the Church. The



home mission was another milestone of my life experience. It was an opportunity to know personally many families and to understand the traits and trials of life. As a provincial, I got many chances to love, to know, and to be closer to the Diocese as well as to the priests.

In 2014, His Excellency Mar George Rajendransdb, Bishop of Thuckalay started CRI, he appointed me as its president. Thus, I got many chances to work and cooperate with other religious congregations. When I was selected for the second time as the provincial on 21 November 2021, I got the responsibilities of CRI. It was a great time to have retreats and pilgrimages together with other religious congregations and to know more about their spirituality and charisms. It was an enriching experience for us all.

Tidings: We came to know also about your heroic decisions like resigning from aided school teacher post, renouncing the high salary, etc. Can you throw light on them?

Sr. Ceelia: God has His plans which are unique and unpredictable. For us religious, it is important to renounce our comfort zones and to work according to the will of God. I came to ThuckalayMission after resigning from an aided school in Kerala where I had been working for five years from 1993 to 1998. When I came here on the mission, I wanted to work among the poor. But my superiors again asked me to take charge of an English Medium school. That was a great burden to me as I didn't



know the language, needed to upgrade the school, there weren't many people to help me, economic crisis, get on and off government offices, etc. I was feeling like I was in the midst of an ocean. But God's mercy is endless. Late Rev. Fr. Philip Kodiyanthara was a great help in my trials. He spent much of his time helping me. He accompanied me several times to Madurai and Chennai for different needs of the school. I suffered a lot for the government recognition of St. Michel's School, Kattathurai.

Once I went to Chennai with Rev. Sr Martin CMC in a government office and we were praying to seek the intercession of St. Alphonsa. And I remember, as a miracle, we got the recognition till 10th grade. These are the adventurous experiences that I remember. But I believe in the words of the Psalmist, "The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, and he refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." (Psalm 23)

Tidings: You wanted to work with the poor and the marginalized? How did you realize it?

Sr. Ceelia: I desired to work for mentally disabled children. Though I could not do it directly as many of my loving sisters do, God has chosen me as an instrument to begin a home for them when I was provincial.

Tidings: In Thuckalay, how do you enjoy your missionary experience?





Sr. Ceelia: There may be occasions during which we think nothing is possible, but for God nothing is impossible. I experienced the mercy of God in each service we render in our province. This is one of the best places for evangelization. Our desires and our projects become an obstacle if we do not plan them with God.

Tidings: What is the great challenge which you face?

Sr. Ceelia: As a provincial, it is my great concern about vocations and the well-being of my sisters. Today the number of aspirants is very less as we become older. With this reduced number of vocations, it is very difficult to think about beginning new missions, in different areas especially in the extended territories of the Diocese.

Tidings: Thank you very much, sister, for the precious time you spent with us. Let us conclude this talk with a positive vibe of your life and a message for the young generation of today.

Sr. Ceelia: I must thank you for your kindness to make ordinary people like me share our life with others. I am very much satisfied with my religious life. It is not me to select the religious life and the FCC Congregation, rather God called me to cooperate with His plan and I have obeyed Him. Today, I am very proud to be called a religious of the Franciscan Clarist Congregation. But I am also conscious about my imperfections and weaknesses and I surrender fully to the mercy of God. The young generation must deepen their faith and pray for an understanding of the will of God. Blessed be the God who created me. Praise be to God. Amen.
