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
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

Dear friends and benefactors of Thuckalay Mission Greetings and prayerful wishes Bishop's House!

May the celebration of the assembly become a Pentecost where our priests, religious and lay people receive an outpouring of the Spirit and become enthusiastic in proclaiming the gospel like the Apostles! Praying for you and for your personal intentions. May our Blessed Mother intercede for all of us!






St. Vincent de Paul Annual day celebration




VISIT OF DEACONS








VOCATION AND MISSION

MISSION AS PASSION



am Fr. Dorathick, OSBCam. Born in Kootamavu, a village in Kanyakumari on the tip of Southern India. My parents are both devoted Catholic and I am so grateful to them who brought me up inculcating in me our Catholic faith. My grandmother, Rajem, inspired me so much having been a woman of prayer, rich in love and charity towards other people. She paved the way for me to Christ and the Church in my early childhood. At the age of 5, I began attending the Eucharistic Celebration with my grandmother who used to go to church daily. My willingness to go to church and my attentiveness during the celebration increased in me the desire to see Christ every day. I was so curious, and I could still recall what my grandmother had told me about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist which made me so fascinated to go to church with my simple faith. I can still remember when I was in line with my mother or grandmother to receive the Holy Communion. I felt so happy every time I lined up for the Holy Communion, at least I could see Christ closely, though I had not received it yet. As a child, I was so excited to know what would happen when we consume the Holy Communion. One of my frequent questions was, "How does Jesus taste?" My grandmother told me that it cannot be explained, but one day I would "taste" Jesus and I would know how good the Lord is! From that day on, I wanted to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion and taste Jesus! That year, my elder brother was about to receive the Holy Communion, so I wished to receive it too! But my parish priest was hesitant due to my young age. He said that I still

needed to learn many prayers. I was almost 8 years old that time. So with enthusiasm I began to learn all the prayers for I was so adamant to receive the Holy Communion. Usually, in our village we celebrate our Parish Feast for 10 days and on the 9th day the First Holy Communion is given. I was kneeling throughout the whole celebration of the Holy Mass for 7 days hoping that my desire to receive the Holy Communion and taste Jesus would be granted. My only prayer was to receive Jesus through the Holy Eucharist. My prayers were not in vain when on the 7th day the parish priest told my parents that I must receive the Holy Communion. The excitement was indescribable when I finally received the Holy Eucharist! It was the first time in my life that I could go into a blissful experience and deep intimacy with Christ. I think I was just 8 years old, I really didn't know what was happening to me! As the days went on, I received Holy Communion every day. Then, a new desire emerged in me, that is, to be an altar boy during weekdays when not many boys will come to church. Seeing an elderly priest who managed to celebrate mass by himself without anyone assisting him led me to think that I could be an altar boy doing service in the altar. Revealing my desire to our parish priest, he jokingly said to me that once I grow up to the height of the altar I can serve as an altar boy. I took seriously what he had just said and from that time on, I frequently went to church early in the morning with my grandmother who used to arrange flowers for our Lady of Perpetual Help. Literally, I used to go to the altar and measure my height with the altar. One day when I measured myself again I was



almost at the height of the altar, so, I ran to the sacristy and told to my parish priest that I already had grown up; therefore, I could serve as an altar boy! And from that day on, I became an altar boy, the youngest among all the other altar boys.

Time flies. I had done my basic education with the Carmelite nuns who had nurtured me to grow more deeply in Christ. Concurrently, I was so curious to explore Hinduism and Islam too. I was fortunate enough to have a number of acquaintances from other religions that had given me the chance to explore temples and mosques which I loved to know, particularly, on how they pray and see God! When I finished my high school at the age of 15, I felt like joining with the OCD fathers where I studied. It was a call to a contemplative life. After exposing my desire to my parents, they advised me to decide after I reached the age of 18. Following my parents' advice, I just kept my desire to become a priest in my heart and continued to serve as an altar boy in my parish. But when I was a teenager, the desire was not so prominent like before but still it was echoing deep in my heart. After I finished my secondary school, I expressed again my desire to my parents but this time they were delighted and without hesitation they communicated this to my parish priest who advised me not to join in a cloistered monastery because the world needs me. Nevertheless, I was convinced in joining the Carmelites. So I told him that it is fine for me whatever he wanted as far as it has a Carmelite spirituality. He suggested an active Carmelite order in Kerala. Immediately, I went to a come-and-see program for a week. More than 60 participants (including myself) were experiencing the life of these active friars for one week. At the end of the program, the rector told me to come back after a month. I returned home and told my parents that I would never become a priest! Actually, I was not impressed by the friars because they had many commercial institutions! To become a priest seemed to be like just an ordinary profession for



them. Therefore, I was not interested anymore! I was so close to my parents and to my only brother so I was thinking that staying with them is the best choice rather than staying in a monastery. In the meantime, I failed in my secondary school examinations. So I could not realize my second wish that is to do yoga and naturopathy BNYS studies. I decided to have a one year diploma on yoga and my parents encouraged me to pursue it. One day, I started reading a book. It was written that in 3 hours sitting with cross leg without any movement one can master a meditation. One night, I tried to do it myself without being taught by anyone. So, I sat and closed my eyes without knowing what to do! But I was very blissful, I got no thoughts in my mind just like when I received my first Holy Communion. I felt the same feelings that lasted for more than 4 hours before I opened my eyes.

After this experience which I kept only to myself, I gradually focused on learning yoga and trained as a teacher of yoga from Sivananda Yoga Vedanta Ashrams (Hindu Ashram) at the age of 19. I started teaching yoga. Later, I also received my bachelor's degree on Alternative Medicines and Psychology. My exploration on yoga allowed me to go to different Ashrams, Temples and beyond other religions from Southern to Northern India to learn different styles of yoga. All of these had helped me to see God beyond names and forms! I was teaching in various schools and seminary too. During that



time, my interest in going to church was declining, perhaps I saw it more ritualistic and hearing the different scandals in the church had made no sense to me at all. I only went to church just to please my mother. One day my father was feeding doves at home when I asked him why we have go to the church if God is everywhere. For me, there is no point in going to church so, I argued with him. He just smiled and asked me, "Do you think these doves have no food in this world that I have to feed them?" I replied to him, "Everywhere they could find food". He then asked me, "Why then they are here? I responded to him, "It is because they knew they would be fed if they come here". My father then beautifully said, "My son, this means that church, temple, or mosque are treasure houses of God and they are where we have to go." This was a mind blowing thought for me! Reflecting on this, I could say that I was saying a contradiction. I realized that I had often said, "God is everywhere, but not in the church. So why could I not see God in the church if He is all present?" This thought made me open my mind to go back to church. In those days, I was too busy teaching yoga. I began early in the morning but despite my busy schedule, I decided to start going to church again! At that time, I was about to go to the Maldives to work in a resort as a yoga teacher. I got my passport and was getting ready for the trip. I had already started going to church. On the first two days I fixed my eyes on a painting of our Lord's Resurrection during the Mass.

On the third day, during the Eucharistic Celebration, I heard a voice saying, "Why don't you become a priest?" This voice disturbed me a lot since on the first two days I fixed my eyes on a painting of our Lord's Resurrection during the Mass. On the third day, during the Eucharistic Celebration, I heard a voice saying, "Why don't you become a priest?" This voice disturbed me a lot since I had no intention to become a priest or a monk anymore. On the fourth day, again I



repeatedly heard the same voice. During this time, my lifestyle was so different. I loved worldly things especially modern electronic gadgets and fashion. I had decided against becoming a monk or priest! But this voice became strong in my heart. I never told anyone, but I searched on the internet for a monastery with a rigid observance and I found the Carthusians. Unfortunately, we didn't have any in India. The second option was the Cistercian Monastery in Kerala which I was interested in. I was so disturbed for a week. Then one day when I did not go church, one of the deacons, Fr. Aneesh, from Adorno Fathers who was helping our parish, came to my home. We were conversing and having a cup of tea and he started to talk about the Cistercian Monastery in Kerala to my father. I was so excited to hear about it because it was secretly my second option. I learned from him that they had a huge farm, so I was thinking that a farm was not in my interest, we had one at home! He also told me about a monk who lived as a hermit in the North of Kerala. This monk had no connections with the world and lived a very simple life. So, I told Fr. Aneesh to inform that monk about a young brother who is ready to join with him. My parents had joyfully given me their consent to become a monk. In a week's time I went to this monastery Dhayana Ashram in Kerala. For one year I enjoyed the everyday life of silence and solitude. Though I was quite talkative but in Ashram nobody talks to this over 85 year old monk. I could only rarely chat to a younger monk named Fr. Anto but most of the time I spent days in silence and prayer happily doing all the works and enjoying the nature around me. I was really convinced to be in this kind of life. What was interesting was that they belong to a Syromalankara Rite which had a long liturgy with lots of symbolic



signs. I enjoyed their hymns too. But suddenly, never had I thought that the Bishop would decide to close the Ashram because there was nobody who could continue their present life so he asked me to join to his diocese. Due to the fact that I felt a deep contemplative call I responded to him frankly that I was not happy to join to his diocese. At that time, Fr. Silvester and Fr. Anto from the Dhayana Ashram had suggested to go to Shantivanam. They asked me to move first to see and make discernments but deep in my heart I felt that it could be my place. Therefore, I went to Saccidananda Ashram. It is a Camaldolese Benedictine Monastery in Tamilnadu. So far, I didn't know anything about Shantivanam. I only had read something about one of the founders of the Ashram.

When I came to the Ashram, I felt love in the atmosphere and the Indian way of their liturgy. I was so much impressed by the simplicity of the monks. I was sent to the formation house which was nearby the Ashram but I was not happy there because I felt it was just like any other formation houses! So I was thinking that this was not my place! The cry of my vocation resonates to my happy experiences in Dhayana Ashram where I sincerely did everything I could during my short stay. I asked God a very human question that why after I left everything, I found myself in this situation. I told Fr. George, the Prior, that I didn't want to continue my life in this Ashram. He asked me if I liked a spiritual life. I simply answered him positively, but the more I loved the more I needed to leave! He advised me to reflect then make a decision. My things were almost packed and I called my mother telling her that I would be home the day after. She just asked me if everything was okay. I replied to her that "no places are good and that all people are corrupt. Therefore, it is better for me to go home!" I never thought that my mom would give me a very clever and profound thought. She told me about the lotus flower which is the most beautiful flower, whose petals will open one by one when it blooms. Despite being beautiful it will only grow in mud and often, dirt. She said to me, "My



son, you have not yet bloomed! If you didn't find what you were looking for, you can come back home." Though my things were already packed and ready to go home this phrase had profoundly touched my heart and an anecdote of Confucius came across my mind saying, "Don't curse the darkness. Light a candle!" These two phrases had given me strength that enlightened the final call. I had written that day about spiritual maturity, "One who has spiritually matured will not be changed by places, people, or situations but rather he or she will have the courage to change the place, people and situations." Then I realized that it is not I who choose but God chose me to a very radical change of heart. I could see and feel the movement from being ego centered to a God centered life. From that time on and still now, I find myself living in Shantivanam Ashram which is one of the most unique Ashrams in the world where the church opens the doors to all. The Camaldolese spirituality and the life in the Ashram is so inspiring day by day. I have 2 hours of meditation, which I love most because it helps me feel the intimacy of Christ every day. Later, I was sent to Kerala for my Philosophical Studies and to Rome, Italy in Pontificio Ateneo Sant'Anselmo for my Theological studies after which I was ordained in 2018 by Bishop George Rajendran (Bishop of Thukalay) soon I became a Prior of Shantivanam Ashram after being nominated by the Prior General before my ordination. I am deeply grateful to my monastic vocation. I listen every moment by the ear of the heart and my response is: "That in all things God may be glorified."


