

FOREVER IN OUR HEARTS

Rev Fr. Philip Kodiyanthara's 11th Death Anniversary





On the 9th of February 2024, the 11th death anniversary of Rev. Fr. Philip Kodiyanthara was commemorated at Kayalpuram. The requiem Holy Qurbana commenced at 11:00 am, with Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, the Vicar General, as main celebrant. Fr. Jose Muttathupadam, Fr. Antony Mahesh, Fr. John Joseph, and Fr. Toji Parambilparambil joined in concelebrating the Holy Qurbana. Fr. Mahesh delivered the homily. In attendance were representatives from Sisters, teachers of aided

schools within the eparchy, and some parishioners from Manjalumoodu Forane Parish, all present for the memorial Holy Qurbana. Following the Holy Qurbana, the Office for the Dead was recited at the tomb of Rev. Fr. Philip Kodiyanthara. Gratitude is extended to all the Fathers who personally took the initiative to participate in this event. Let us collectively continue to pray for the departed soul of our former Eparchial Administrator.



On-Going Formation Programme for priests

'The on-going formation of priests is the natural and absolutely necessary continuation of the process of building priestly personality which began and developed in the seminary with the training programme which aimed at ordination' (PDV no.71). The Presbyterium of the Diocese convened for a two-day gathering at Sangamam on the 13th and 14th of February 2024. On the first day, three distinguished scholars facilitated the ongoing formation programme in three sessions: morning, afternoon, and evening. Mar Jose Porunnedom, Bishop of Mananthavady, led the morning session, addressing the topic 'Challenges to priesthood (internal and external), Ministerial problems of priests (attitudes, parish issues, relation with bishop and authority), and spiritual life of priests (union with Christ, holiness, fidelity to the Church)'. In the afternoon, Adv. Thomas Franco, retired general secretary of All India SBI managers union, conducted a seminar on the 'Socio-Political situation of Tamil Nadu in the context of the upcoming election. In the evening, Rev. Fr. Abraham Kavilpurayidathil, the chancellor of Major Archiepiscopal curia, animated a session clarifying the canonical issues related to marriage and parish administration. All sessions proved to be highly informative and pastorally enriching for the priestly ministry in the diocese.

The following day, 14th February, was dedicated to the evaluation and presentation of the reports of activities from various departments and pious associations of the Eparchy. This marked the third time that the diocese allocated almost a full day for this exercise. Directors of departments came well-prepared with PowerPoint presentations, beautifully outlining the year's activities. The Presbyterium engaged in discussions and provided valuable suggestions. The comprehensive overview left everyone feeling happy and proud to be informed of the enormous work being carried out in the various departments.











Talent fest, an annual event organized by AIDACT and KKSSS, brought together students and educators from seven special schools for a day of spirited competition and celebration on 16 February 2024. Various competitions, including dances, speeches, painting, drawing, and singing, showcased the talents of the participants. Karunai Illam special school clinched the first prize, followed by Jyothinilayam special school Palappallam in second place and Santhinilayam special school Paruthivilai school securing the third position. The atmosphere was filled with joy as participants expressed their happiness. Along with Bishop, Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, Rev. Fr. Jose Muttathupadam and Rev. Fr. Aby Poovathummoottil addressed the gathering, emphasizing the significance of the occasion.




CUMBUM ECHOES

HEALTHIER HORIZONS Highlights from the Medical Camp

On 25th February, an extensive health awareness programme took place at St. Paul's Church, Thettiyodu, featuring an awareness rally, a free medical camp, and fullbody checkups. Additionally, a heart awareness programme was held at Little Flower Forane Church, Pilankalai, on 19th February, led by Sr. Vineetha FCC. Similar heart care programmes were conducted in Tenkasi and Madurai Missions. In numerous locations, the awareness class was facilitated by Sr. Josephine CTC, the Secretary of the Health Commission, TNBC.











Inauguration of II Presbyteral Council

The Inauguration and First Meeting of the 2nd Presbyteral Council were conducted at Sangamam on 27th February 2024. The session commenced at 10 am with a prayer, and after the welcome address by Rev. Fr. Thomas Powathuparampil, Rev. Bishop delivered the inaugural speech for the 2nd Presbyteral Council. Two Fathers from the Archdiocese of Changanacherry, Fr. Tom Puthenkalam and Fr. Roby Thalachelloor, enriched the inaugural session by providing valuable insights to the council members. Fr. Tom emphasized the importance of collegiality and communion among the Bishop and Priests in the diocese,

drawing from church documents. Fr. Roby focused on the statutes of the Presbyteral Council of our diocese and offered useful suggestions for addressing our concerns. In the second session, the council assembled, and the secretary presented the report of the last Presbyteral Council. Following this, new members were elected, with Fr. Joshy Kulathumkal securing a second term as secretary, and Fr. Jose Muttathupadam, Fr. Robin Koorumullil, and Fr. Printo Kurias being elected as agenda committee members. The meeting included a common discussion, concluding by 01:30 pm.







Seven Deacons from the diocese of Ramanathapuram came to our diocese for a mission and pastoral experience on 06 February 2024. They went back on 25 February 2024. After one week of tamil intensive course at Sangamam they stayed in following parishes and mission places: Nithiravilai, Killiyoor, Marappady, Varuthattu, Kalluvilai, Pathukani, Annikkarai, Kayathar, Virudunagar and Tenkasi.
