



Greetings and prayerful wishes from Bishop's House, Thuckalay.

I am sure these will give you a panoramic view of the Diocese. We do value your participation and involvement in the Diocese. We in the Diocese assure you that you and your near and dear ones are continuously in our prayers.

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis declared the beginning of a Year of St Joseph on 8 December 2020 for the Universal Church. The timing was perfect, coming on the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pius IX declaring St Joseph as the Patron of the Catholic Church and on the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, Joseph's spouse. Along with the Pope's announcement in his Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde* - Heart of the Father - came a proclamation from the Apostolic Penitentiary about special plenary indulgences that are now available for this Year of St Joseph.

Pope Francis describes St Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. The Holy Father wrote *Patris Corde* against the backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us to see more clearly the importance of ordinary people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble St Joseph, the man who goes unnoticed - a daily, discreet and hidden presence - who nonetheless played an incomparable role in the history of salvation. May St Joseph intercede for all of us.

St Mary's Minor Seminary, which is located at Mukkoottukal, was established in the year 1998 by the then Bishop of the Diocese, now our Major Arch Bishop of Syro Malabar Church, Cardinal Mar George Alencherry. Presently, Bishop George Rajendran SDB takes keen interest in the formation of the Seminarians for future leadership for the Church.

The Seminary is committed to providing basic formation in order to kindle the young minds in priestly vocation and at the same time make them complete their Higher Secondary Course. The young seminarians are to acquire a sufficient knowledge of languages, a proper method of study, habit of reading and articulation of one's ideas along with the spiritual formation that they undergo. The young minds spent 4 years of their life in the Seminary – in the first year, the seminarians are oriented towards basic information of the Church, liturgy and practices of the Church, two years are spent on Higher Secondary Education and the final year is spent on discernment through human and spiritual values.

At present the strength of the Seminary is 12 with 8 brothers in the fourth (final) year and from the remaining four, two brothers are third years, are doing their Plus-Two, and two brothers are second years and are doing their Plus-One in the Holy Family Higher Secondary School, Mukkoottukal.

The present seminary staff consist of Rev. Dr. Joshy Kulathumkal, as Rector; Rev. Fr Alex Moolakunnel, being the spiritual father and Rev. Fr. Shijo Aikkarakunnel, the Dean of studies.


AT CHENAMCODE CONVENT

Priests' Orientation Programme





he Diocese began the observation of the Holy Season of Lent on 15 February 2021. It is a time of intense preparation for the celebration of the Paschal Mysteries of Jesus Christ. In our tradition, the period of Lent is also called 50 *Nonbum Oruthalum* (50 days of Fasting and Penance). This is because, all the days beginning from the Ash Monday of the Lent, including Sundays, are counted as days of abstention. The issue of whether the season of Lent should extend for 40 days (as is the case in the Latin Church) or 50 days, is a matter of liturgical tradition. The most important aspect is the spiritual essence of Lent. The ultimate purpose of all Lenten observations is the spiritual succour that all Catholics yearn for.



JUBILEE CENTRAL COMMITTEE MEETING

Aspecial meeting of the Jubilee Central Monitoring Committee and Central Animation Committee along with all the heads of departments and pious associations was held on 19 February 2021 at Sangamam. Sr Alice Viji CMC is the Provincial of Chavara Province of Thuckalay of the Congregation of Mother of Carmel (CMC) since 2018. She was also the Provincial of the Changanassery Province from December 2006 to December 2012. Sr. Viji played the role of a catalyst in raising the CMC Chavara Region, Thuckalay into a Vice Province first and then into a Province.

Sr Alice was born on 8 December 1952 at Champakara, Kottayam, Kerala to Matthew Kalladayil and Mariyamma. They are 5 sisters and one brother in the family. While she was studying in School, she was inspired by two sisters, namely Sr. Theresa Nedunkunnam and Sr. Regis to join religious life. They provided a lot of guidance and care and they gradually become her role models. Sr. Alice was attracted to the Congregation of Mother of Carmel, when she observed the sisters' silent prayer in the school chapel and their life. She observed the sisters sitting for long hours in front of the Blessed Sacrament in the Chapel. The sisters had taught her ejaculatory prayers. To encourage her to make the right choices in life, the sisters shared with her books of the saints and asked her to write the summary after reading.

Sr. Alice takes joy in her religious life in her prayer and meditation. She feels that when she kneels in front of the Blessed Sacrament, she enjoys a special peace within her. This has been her strength throughout her religious life. She wishes to lead a saintly life.

Sr. Alice, besides her duties and pious practices in the Convent, enjoys reading, listening to music and talking with fellow sisters and lay people in order to provide them some insight into the mission of Christ.



Sr. Alice states that she had faced and continues to face challenges in life – beginning with parting with the parents was very difficult as she was the first child in the family; the parents did not allow her to chose religious life in the initial stage, but then they put a condition saying that she was allowed to go to the convent, however, she was advised to be completely loyal to the religious life for ever.

Sr. Alice further says that being the provincial of one of the biggest provinces, Changnassery in Kerala was a big challenge. Organizing everyone, every institutions and regulating the order was truly a challenge. However, she has always believed in the spirit of God which has guided her throughout her life. She also states that moving to Thuckalay Province was the next challenge, language, culture, inadequacy of sisters, non-availability of financial resources were some of the difficulties that she continues to face.

As a religious, Sr. Alice wishes to be like St. Little Flower, simple, prayerful and to be a small soul loving Jesus. The self motivation that she always undertakes is that she seeks Jesus in her inabilities and weaknesses. She strongly believes and keeps hearing the words in her prayers, "My Grace is sufficient for you".

Sr. Alice advises the young minds to consider religious life and carry on the missionary works of the Church. She states that it a joyful life that one can get; she gets a lot of sisters around to support, share and to live with. Prayer life is the supportive factor and all sisters stand together in communion with each other in front of the Lord. The spirit of belongingness in a community that serves gives the strength to move ahead in joy. She believes that a religious sister is welcomed everywhere. She urges young girls to join the mission of Christ.
