Fraternal Greetings from Bishop's House!

RIP - REV. FR MATHEW PLATHOTTAM MST

We have just witnessed yet another tragedy in the Diocese: the untimely passing away of Rev. Mathew Plathottam MST on 21 October 2013due to a massive heart attack. The sad news reached us on 22 October at 8.30 am when we had just begun our annual spiritual retreat. He was 60 years old and was undergoing treatment for heart related diseases. He served our Diocese for the last 10 years in Sengottai Mission, Palugal Parish and Chenamcode Parish. I thank you for accepting the suggestion to cancel the retreat and to take part in the last rites of Fr Mathew at Palugal and his funeral service next day at Deepti Bhavan, Bharnaganam.

Rev Fr Mathew was born on 17 September 1953 at Marangattupilly, Kerala. His parents were late Mr Joseph and Mrs Thresia Plathottam. He has six brothers and two sisters. After his high school studies he joined Deepti Minor Seminary in 1972. He belonged to the 4th batch of Deepti. He completed his Philosophical and Theological studies from Carmelgiri and Mangalappuzha seminaries respectively. He was ordained a Priest for MST Society on 29 December 1982. As a Priest, Fr Mathew served in different capacities in various Dioceses. He served in the Diocese of Mananthawady (present Bhadravathy) as Assistant Parish Priest at N.R. Pura (1983-1986) and as Parish Priest at Sangameswarpet (1985-1986). He worked as Assistant Director at Ragimuddanahalli (1986-1987) and Assistant Priest in-charge at Guthalu (1987-1988) in the Diocese of Mandya. Fr Mathew served as Parish Priest at Karappadam (1988-1991) and Karakurissi (1991-1995) in the Diocese of Palakkad, Vellanikode (1996-1999), Cheruthuruthy (1999-2002) and Vellarakad (2002-2004) in the diocese of Trichur. He was director, Pulari Social Service Society, Shenkottai (2004- 2008), Parish priest at Palukal (2008- 2013) and at Chenamcode (2013 May – October) in the diocese of Thuckalay.

Rev. Fr Mathew's contribution to our Diocese is immense; he was instrumental in the development of Pulari Social Service Society at Sengottai and worked hard for the formation of Christian community there. Through various outreach programmes, he was able help hundreds of poor people to establish themselves in life. The second leg of his ministry in the Diocese was at Palukal as Parish Priest. It was his dream to have a new church built at Palukal and he took various steps to realise the same. Unfortunately he could not accomplish the project due to financial constraints.

He was a Priest par excellence after the heart of Christ; he knew his faithful and loved them dearly. He entered into their lives; he was a spiritual father, brother and counsellor to them. Despite his ill health, he carried out all the responsibilities as a Parish Priest. It seemed that, he had a special gift to listen to people and empathise with them. They saw in him a father who cared for them. He was endowed with the gift of healing which he faithfully carried out in the Parishes where he worked. His involvement in the *Vanthuparungal* monthly retreat programme at Palukal was something commendable. He was a wonderful companion to Rev. Fr Joseph Nedumpuram in carrying out devotedly the spiritual activities.

During his tenure, the Angel Garments Unit at Palukal witnessed steep growth and development. He was very much concerned about the welfare of its staff. He believed that better working conditions of the staff would bring about better results in the production of the centre. Like a good shepherd he knew every member of the staff and their family conditions. Every day he made it a point to visit them at the first floor of the building and held regular meetings to encourage them. I am sure the staff of the Angel Garments Unit as well as the parishioners will miss him dearly.

When he was transferred to Chenamcode in the month of May 2013, Rev Fr Mathew accepted the transfer with faith knowing that it would cause him a lot of inconveniences as he had to look after two mission centres both at Kulasekaram and Chenamcode. He was very faithful in carrying out his spiritual activities and never missed Holy Qurbana in the two mission stations. I had contacted him from Rome on his Birthday and Feast day and enquired about his health. After my return, he asked permission to go for a spiritual retreat at Anakara, Kanjirapally. Though the annual retreat for the priests in the diocese was scheduled from 21 October Fr. Mathew opted for making retreat in the previous week. This perhaps was his immediate preparation for his final journey.

On the evening of 21 October Fr. Mathew had supper with the sisters and told them about his bad health and they advised him to go for a health check up. He agreed to go to a doctor next day after morning mass. The next day, on 22nd October, the sisters were waiting for him for the morning mass. But since he did not come for the mass they went in search of him but they could not find him. They learned that his room was locked from inside, but there was no response to their call. They opened the window glass and to their shock they saw Fr. Mathew lying near his bed. They immediately informed me. I along with Fr. Jose Muttathupadam and Fr. Mathew Mulangacherry MST rushed to the spot and confirmed his death due to cardiac arrest. At 11.00 am we celebrated Holy Qurbana in Chenamcode parish to pray for the departed soul and later took the body to Palukal Parish where he served nearly five years. It was from here that we gave final farewell to Fr. Mathew from Thuckalay diocese. I along with all the fathers of the diocese celebrated the Holy Qurbana, a large number of sisters and faithful gathered in tears to bid good bye to Fr. Mathew.

The relatives of Fr. Mathew took the body to their paternal home at Marangattupilly in the night itself on 22 October, accompanied by the vicar General and a few fathers from our diocese. I reached his Parish in the next day morning and accompanied his body along with the family members and a large number of priests to Deepti Bhavan, Bharnaganam.

The body of Fr. Mathew reached Deepti Bhavan by 11.30 a.m. on 22nd and was kept at Aaraam Chapel for people to pay homage. Bishop Mar George Madathikandam, Bishop Mar Joseph Kallarangatt and Bishop Mar Jacob Muricken came and prayed for him and showed their love for him. A large number of priests and sisters from far and wide reached Deepti to pray for him and to show their solidarity. Good number of people had gathered from the different parishes of Thuckalay, Trichur and Palakkad where Fr. Mathew served. The presence of the large number of people was a clear indication of the place of Fr. Mathew in their hearts.

The funeral services started at Aaraam Chapel at 1.30 p.m. officiated by the Director General of MST. In the beginning he gave a brief sketch of the life and ministry of Fr. Mathew in different places. The Fr. Jose Muttathupadam, the Vicar General of our diocese read out the condolence message sent by the Major Archbishop from Bankok, Thailand. In his message the Major Archbishop fondly remembered the good works that Fr. Mathew had done in the diocese when he was bishop there. I officiated the funeral mass and gave the homily.

No words can express our sincere gratitude to the Superior General and the members of the Society of St Thomas (MST) for generously lending Rev Fr Mathew Plathottam to our Diocese for nearly 10 years. His family members were a great support to him during his time of illness and with care and concern they took the body to their home. We thank the FCC community of Chenamcode for taking care of Rev. Fr Mathew and also seeing to the final preparation of the body to be taken to Kerala. The CMC community of Vanchinagar, the SH community of Palukal and the SABS community of Kulasekaram have been great support to Rev Fr Mathew during his ministry and I thank them on behalf of the Diocese. I was happy that we all went for the funeral service of Rev Fr Mathew and prayed for the departed soul. I thank all the Religious Sisters and Faithful who came in large numbers both at Palukal and Bharnaganam to take part in the final rites.

Rev Fr Mathew Plathottam was a simple, soft spoken, loving and committed missionary. He was a good pastor, who loved his people and died for them. All those who knew him loved him and gained something from him. He was hard working, doing everything possible for his people. I know it is very hard for us to accept this great loss. Yet we all bow to the feet of the Lord and submit to His will. We fully trust that He is in control of every situation. The way he prepared himself for his final journey, we are sure he has gone to his heavenly abode to receive his reward from the heavenly Father. We all miss Rev. Fr Mathew very much; but we have an advocate in heaven to intercede for all of us and for our Diocese. Let us remember him in our prayers. May he rest in peace in the Lord!

To commemorate the Months' Mind, there will be a concelebrated Holy Qurbana at Chenamcode on 21 November 2013. Kindly inform all the Sisters and the Faithful in your respective Parishes about it.

NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE

HOME MISSION

The Home Mission in Padanthalumoodu is complete and it has produced the desired results. PASTORL COUNCIL

The Newly constituted 4th Pastoral Council of the Diocese had its first meeting on 2 November 2013. Out of 102 members 90 were present. Rev. Fr James Palakal, the Syngelus of Changanacherry Archdiocese animated the members on the topic 'Duties and Responsibilities of Pastoral Council.' This was followed by Group Discussions on the theme: Spiritual Renewal and New Mission Stations. Then the reports of the discussions were presented. I am happy to note that every one took part in the deliberations and gave constructive points for serious study and execution. They will be studied in our forthcoming Priests' Conference. I would like to thank you dear Fathers for your cooperation and support in the process of election of Pastoral Council members. Please inform the Pastoral Council members from your Parish that if they are absent consecutively three times, they will lose their membership in the Pastoral Council.

CML RALLY

1 November was celebrated as All Saints' Day. On that day the KKSSS premises witnessed a hosts of young saints adorned in colourful attire along with 1500 CML children. The Mission League Rally was organised to commemorate the conclusion of the Year of Faith in the Diocese. The children along with their Animators, Sisters and Fathers marched from KKSSS, Kaluvilai to Plankalai Parish along the National High Way shouting Mission League and Year of Faith slogans. Since the whole Rally was given a competitive tone, the Forane level CML children displayed colourful uniforms, decorations and floats representing themes on the Year of Faith. It was a public witness of faith meant to instil faith in the hearts of young children.

I am grateful to Rev. Fr Ginoy Thottiyil, Director of CML for the meticulous planning and execution. Special words of thanks to Forane level CML Directors, all the Animators, Parish Priests and Sisters for encouraging and preparing the children. I could see your whole hearted cooperation and dedication. It looked as if each team was better than the other. We cannot but forget the Vincent de Paul and Marian Senai members who came in large numbers to help out in the Rally and distribution of refreshment. I thank Rev Fr Saji Elambaserril, Director, KKSS and Rev. Fr Chako Akathara CMI and community for facilitating the programme in their Centres.

Hence, do not worry if the projects did not come up to your expectations. As far as possible, kindly help the children to prepare themselves. I thank all of you for taking these exhibitions seriously. They are means to catechise the children. Special thanks to Rev. Fr Jossy Puthenpurakal, the Promoters, Headmasters and Teachers.

The 17th Diocesan Day was celebrated on 9 November 2013 at Sangamam. All the Parishes and Institutions were represented. Fathers and Sisters came in large numbers to celebrate the solemn occasion. CONCLUSION

On 1 December, we shall enter the holy season Annunciation (*Subara*), while Latins and Armenians call it *Advent* comes from the Latin *advenio*, 'to come to,' and refers to the coming of Christ. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; but second, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to His Second Coming at the end of time. As pastors, it is our bounden duty to prepare our people to enter worthily into this holy season and live the Advent with them so that collectively as people of God we can celebrate the birth of Jesus on Christmas Night with great fervour and devotion.
