Dear and Rev. Fathers,

Greetings and prayerful wishes Bishop's House, Thuckalay!

As the year 2020 is ebbing away, we are entering the new year 2021. Whenever we end a year and begin another year, we think of the wonderful gift of God, namely, time. Although God is above time, we are blessed with time with which we can grow, develop and become more humane and spiritual. While wishing you a prosperous and grace-filled New Year, let me remind you that we need to make good use of the precious gift of time that God has generously given to us.

The new year is a gift, totally free and full of promises. The whole lot of opportunities and possibilities lie ahead of us and it is up to us as individuals and communities, to decide what sort of history we will fill it up with, day by day and moment by moment. Certainly our own involvement or 'yes' will be the determining factor towards the actualization of God's plan as it was in the life of our Blessed Mother Mary. No one likes stagnation but rather would like to see our institutions and our apostolate move forward. Every year as we grow chronologically, it is important that we set targets also to grow into better human beings emotionally, mentally, spiritually, intellectually and in being evangelizers of the young effectively. I wish and pray that the future sees us moving ahead and making steady progress in personal life, be it health, professional growth orpriestly life.

The message of God's constant and caring presence that we meditate during Christmas season is reflected in the inspiring acts of frontline and other essential workers the past year. Their sacrifice and heroism have been a source of courage and perseverance during months of hardships, uncertainties and other challenges. The arrival of the COVID-19 vaccines is a blessing of renewed hope and a much-awaited answer to people's prayers and aspirations of getting back to our normal lives.

The outlook for the new year is bright, but depends on us to make it a reality. It allows us to turn the page of time and history to brace ourselves for what better things it offers us. One good thing the pandemic taught us is that we are all in this together, and the best answer to its disastrous effect is our unity and solidarity. Pope Francis said recently in the backdrop of a divided and polarized world, that "a crisis can be overcome by the antibodies of solidarity." This was the central message in his recent encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, – the call to global fraternity and social friendship, that all people will live together as a family, as brothers and sisters to one another, treating each other with dignity and equality.

Furthermore, in his message for 2021 World Day of Peace, Our Holy Father promotes a culture of care as a path to peace, urging us against the prevailing culture of indifference to the sufferings of others, of waste, of hatred and confrontation, to practice the Social Teachings of the Catholic Church. Let this culture of care start in the family, the fundamental nucleus of our society, where we first learn how to live together and relate to each other with mutual love and respect.

The new year brings a sense of renewal, a chance to reflect on who we are as people of faith and how we might become better followers of Christ. The lessons of the past year highlighted our global interconnectedness and solidarity, our belief in the sanctity of life and respect for the dignity of every human person. We learned that showing our love for one another, friend or stranger, can be as simple as wearing a mask. The inconvenience of such practice is far outweighed by the opportunity to show our regard for the wellbeing of one another.

The Feast of Mary, the Mother of God ushers the start of the new year. This is a perfect time to invoke the loving intercession and maternal protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary to help us join together in mutual resolution to live the Gospel values of faith, hope and charity, as well as to grow in our commitment as responsible stewards of God's gift of creation and to pursue the common good.

The Solemnity of Epiphany that we mark on 3 January is a celebration of God's manifestation of Himself through His son Jesus Christ. Epiphany refers to God's Self-revelation as well as to the revelation of Jesus as His Son. It is an older celebration than the feast of Christmas, having originated in the East in the late second century. In Italy and Spain, the gifts traditionally associated with the Christmas season are exchanged today, on the feast of the Epiphany. Among Italians, it is believed that the gifts are brought by the old woman, *Befana*(from Epiphany), whereas Spanish custom attributes the gifts to the kings or magi. In the Western Church, the feast commemorates the coming of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. In the Eastern Church, the feast also commemorates the baptism of Christ. The angels revealed Jesus to the shepherds, and the star revealed him to the Magi, who had already received hints of him from Jewish scriptures. Later, God the Father revealed Jesus' identity to Israel at his baptism in the Jordan. In the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus revealed himself as the promised Messiah. These multiple revelations are all suggested by the Feast of the Epiphany. The Epiphany can be looked on as a symbol for our pilgrimage through life to Christ. The feast invites us to see ourselves as images of the Magi, a people on a journey to Christ.

The year 2021 is important for each one of us as it is the silver jubilee year of the establishment of our Eparchy. The preparations for the great jubilee already began in 2019 and we shall conclude the celebrations in the month of November 2021. As you are aware, our Eparchy was established by the papal Bull *Apud Indorum* on 11 November 1996. It was erected separating the area of the Archdiocese of Changanacherry that extended over to the state of Tamil Nadu. The then Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Changanacherry Fr George Alencherry was appointed the first bishop of the new Eparchy. Since then our eparchy has grown not only in numbers but also in area. Today almost one third area of the State of Tamil Nadu comes under the jurisdiction of the Eparchy. The number of priests and religious have grown. Hence, it is a moment of thanksgiving to the Almighty for the great things that He has done for us. We need to intensify our preparations so that when we conclude the celebrations we have made great strides that would help our faithful to come closer to the person of Christ.

May the New Year that we are about to enter in be a blessed and peaceful one for us all. We have many things to look forwards to during the course of the new year. Each of us will have our own personal wish list and expectations. I pray that the new year may inspire each one of us to dispel the frustrations, sufferings, grief and loneliness of those who have lost loved ones due to the coronavirus pandemic. Christmas season is a great reminder of God's infinite love for us in the incarnation of Jesus. Born as our Saviour, he came to bring light, joy and peace to the world! May God bless us with the peace, joy and hope 2021 brings. Happy New Year!
