

The name of the Youth Movement has been changed from TCYM to Syro-Malabar Youth Movement (SMYM) Diocese ofThuckalay.

Rev. Sr Mary Xavier, belonging to the Congregation of Sisters of Divine Saviour, passed away on 13 December 2021. She made her first profession in the Congregation on 19 March 1980 and was sent to Germany where she completed her Diploma in Nursing. She worked in the Animation Centre of Kottar Diocese, Pastoral Centre of Palayamkottai Diocese and Manvila Boys' Home of Trivandrum Diocese. In all the three dioceses, she worked as a sincere and responsible person with dedication. On 7 March 2021 Sr Mary Xavier took charge as superior of Nagercoil community and she was doing her responsibility with same dedication and commitment and she served as superior in many communities. She was a lovable, obedient and hard-working person.

She complaint of persistent cough and breathing difficulty for which she was admitted in the Holy Cross Hospital for treatment and she was diagnosed with lung cancer in the month of October. Though she underwent a series of chemotherapy in RCC, Trivandrum her health condition worsened day by day. On 13 December 2021, Sr Mary Xavier had severe breathing trouble and at 11.30 pm she departed to her heavenly home. The funeral was held on 15 December 2021 at their convent in Manjalumoodu. His Excellency Mar George Rajendran SDB officiated the liturgy and the funeral rite. Many priests, religious and faithful along with the grieving SDS Sisters took part in the funeral service.

Bishop also requested them to bring together people who are not regular to the Church. The Bishop shared the joy of Christmas with cutting the cake and distributing to all the faithful. Indeed, a day of great joy for the people of Kuzhinjanvilai. The Bishop expressed his gratitude to Rev. Fr Abilash Xavier and Mr. Mariadhas for providing the opportunity to visit the people in their village.

The Diocese takes special interest in contacting and helping in the spiritual needs of the faithful who are away from their parishes for various reasons. The migrant apostolate of our Diocese headed by Rev. Fr Sumesh organises regular online meetings and prayer with them. Christmas was an occasion for gathering all the migrant community online on 17 December 2021. The online celebration began with a prayer song. All the families were introduced to the Bishop and to each other. Time was given for everyone to express their experiences and concerns. The daughter and wife of Mr Severius from Bahrain performed a dance online which was appreciated by everyone. Rev. Fr Thomas Powathuparampil, Vicar General delivered the Christmas message. His Excellency Mar George Rajendran sdb concluded the meeting with a Christmas message. A Christmas cake was cut in the Bishop's House, accompanied by a migrant family, who have come for vacation to their home town. There is a joy of being away, yet together in Christ.







The Madurai Syro-Malabar migrant community at Deepakam celebrated the **Pre-Christmas programme** on **12 December 2021** at **Chavara Mission Church**. His Excellency Mar George Rajendran SDB was happy to preside over the Holy Qurbana along with the Parish Priest Rev. Fr Babu Thattil and the community at Madurai. There was a Christmas get-together for the parishioners. Programs highlighting the birth of Jesus were performed on the stage by children and parishioners. A Christmas cake was cut and distributed to everyone, keeping the Christmas spirit alive.


Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil *Kudaiyachan* with a heart to shelter people in Jesus

he disciples of Jesus felt an urge within themselves for announcing, witnessing, sharing all that they have received, all that the Lord has bestowed and given to them to people of all kinds. Today, we too can feel the apostolic and missionary zeal of many pioneer missionaries who touched the suffering and the afflicted in order to share the destiny of hope, that indubitable note which comes from knowing that we are accompanied by the Lord. Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil is one among them who did not keep the Lord to himself, but flaming with the evangelizing spirit of the Church, had expressed his intrinsic desire for the transformation of the world and in the care of creation. As we commemorate the 25th year of his demise on 25 December 2021, it is important to recall his good works for the growth of our mission. The entire Syro-Malabar Church recollected his missionary zeal, with our Major Archbishop Mar Cardinal George Allencherry himself leading the memorial Holy Mass.

Looking past to the pictorial history of the Diocese and then mission, a priest in cassock with a long umbrella, in the person of Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil, strikes the hearts and minds of the elderly in the Diocese who have witnessed the missionary in him. The distance which he walked through the

land of Kanyakumari is countless. How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!" (Is 52,7). Through his simple and humble style of life and prayerful heart, he had attracted many people to the love of Jesus and to Christian Faith. What inspired him to be a missionary in our land?

No doubt! It is the Christian faith formation which he received from his birth on 23 March 1927 from his parents. Palai, being the cradle of priestly vocations in Kerala, nurtured the call of God in the heart of Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil very early in his life. After his ordination on 16 March 1957, his missionary spirit and the zeal for the poor brought him to the land of Ooty hills in Tamilnadu, where he started exercising his priestly ministry. It was his first heroic act which had been a testimony for the boundless love of Christ. After some years of service in Ooty for the poor and afflicted, the Spirit of the Lord inspired him to render his service to the southern tip of Tamilnadu – Kanyakumari.

It was in 1976, he reached Kanyakumari to take up his new mission. As he served many years in Ooty, language was not a barrier for him; Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil communicated very fluently with people in the villages. As he began his ministry here, he observed that a majority of the people were living in utter poverty. He walked from place to place visiting the families and he had all the time and patience to listen to their woes. Rev. Fr Vakkayil





surrendered to God the pathetic situation of the people in his prayers. He worked for bringing in funds to help the neediest families, without having to discriminate them on the basis of their creed or caste. The common people began to connect with him very fast as they were very happy with his simplicity and friendly approach.

Even though he was short in physical stature, people would say, he was a man of high intellectual with purest love for the poor and the suffering. He walked very fast so much so that, the people say, others would be running to match his walking speed. In some areas where he served, people addressed him as Kuttisamiyar. He would not hesitate or fear in venturing into newer places for his mission as he fervently believed in the words of St. Paul, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8, 31) He would not hesitate to teach the catechumens even in the night in order to prepare them for their baptism. Being pretty fluent in Tamil and with assistance from capable and qualified lay people, he translated the Liturgy and Catechism into the Tamil language. He was very rigid in the liturgical practices, being much disciplined with the historical and traditional principles of the Church. This touched the lives of the people, who had a reverential fear towards Rev. Fr. Vakkayil. His priestly ministry as the coordinator of the Kanyakumari Mission, was not to be rooted to his office, but rather it was a meaningful journey of miles and miles surrendering himself and his people to the will of God, pleading through his fervent prayers for support to come for the poor. The missionary enthusiasm exhibited by Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil was of great inspiration to the priests, then missionaries from other dioceses to the Kanyakumari Mission, to offer their lives for the welfare and progress of the people in every aspect of their lives. He was a far-sighted person for the Church and invested in a number of properties in prospective places of growth for the Church and brought in Church personnel to begin ground work. Rev. Fr Vakkavil brought the SABS Congregation to Soosaipuram, today it has grown into a province; he shifted himself to the work room in the school and provided the presbytery for the sisters.

During the famine and hunger that struck the people, Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil understood very well that the people were struggling even for drinking water. He arranged finances, asked people to give land and constructed deep wells around the habitations of people for drinking water. Agriculture was providing

them some means of livelihood, however, there was no water for agriculture. He helped to construct deep wells with steps for people to draw water for agriculture and for their bathing purposes. The wells that he had helped to create still exist as testimony for his concern for the welfare of the suffering people, and some of them continue to be used. He went to the assistance of extremely poor families and helped them replace the thatch in their houses with tiled roofs. The people continue to speak of hard work, love, dedication, strict nature of Rev. Fr Mathew Vakkayil.

As he had always carried a long umbrella with him, either carrying it on his shoulder or holding firmly by the two arms, keeping the umbrella on the back waist or using it as a support for his immense walking, people lovingly called him as Kudaiyachan. But he was really a Kudaiyachan, to shelter many under the loving care of Jesus, spiritually and materially. He was always much preoccupied for the betterment of the people. In order to provide quality education to the poor, he established the APJM Matriculation School at Soosaipuram and now it is one of the prestigious institutions in the district. Rev. Fr Vakkavil established the school at Killivur and he upgraded the Sacred Heart School at Padanthalumoodu. There are a number of missions in the district that he himself had begun, namely, Killiyur, Mathapuram and Nagercoil and he cared for parishes and mission centres like Padanthalumoodu, Soosaipuram, Mankarai, Mezhakode and Thakkalivilai. As a mission coordinator for more than 8 years, he realized the best collaboration from the priests and religious

serving in different places and ministries. Weekly meetings, assessments, evaluations and sharing had helped priests and sisters to improve their mission services at different levels during those initial years. All the senior priests in our Diocese share their great joy and love for collaborating with Rev. Fr Vakkayil, which in turn made their life exemplary for the Diocese.

People of Thuckalay ever remember him as an energetic priest, who never cared for himself even at dolorous



situations in life. He was a diabetic patient, but never complained of his ailments. His heart always burnt to contribute for the mitigation of pain among the suffering people. "A merciful heart is able to be a place of refuge for those who are without a home or have lost their home; it is able to build a home and a family for those forced to emigrate; it knows the meaning of tenderness and compassion. A merciful heart can share its bread with the hungry and welcome refugees and migrants." (World Youth Day, Krakow 2016). The personality of Kudaiyachan and Kuttisamiyar can be summarized in these words.

He had longed very much for the erection of the Diocese of Thuckalay and God granted him life to witness spiritually the erection of the Diocese of Thuckalay in the year 1996. And in the same year, on Christmas day, Rev. Fr Mathew

Vakkayil breathed his last. The Diocese of Thuckalay is ever grateful to a missionary priest, who sets an example for each one of us to possess a loving heart for the poor and the suffering.
